The fundamental of success in any enterprise, is that money which goes into it must be returned with interest, and there are so many who never realize this, no matter how good they may be in other respects.

I have still been unable to get the information to close the Bellevue books to the end of the year, and am going to try and do the best I can without it. There is a slight difference in the account for hogs as appearing in your Rainbow statements and as furnished me by Lambert, your amount being \$296.77 and his \$295.00. When the bill is settled, it must of course bear his O.K., and I would suggest that you take it up with him. I had always assumed that in making this trade with him you had an understanding as to payment. He did not consult me, and since the first of the year has assured me that Bellevue from now on will carry itself.
