RE BELLEVUE RANCH.

I wrote you on Saturday re Bellevue Ranch, and to-day have your letter of December 4th.

First, I must thank you for seeing Lambert and getting up the statement he has given to you of the accounts.

Taking your letter in detail, I note the following -- Instead of the value of Oats being \$225. as given to me when in Vernon, it now appears to be \$151.31, of which \$128.81 went to Rainbow and \$32.50 to Laidman; also the cow, the value of which was given to me when in Vernon as \$125. is worth \$70. ^{13 years} As it is impossible for me to do anything with this last item, I accept herewith your offer to take it over for Rainbow at \$70., crediting Bellevue Ranch account with the amount.

Regarding the other items of equipment, if they are ^{not} of any value to Rainbow, and nothing can be allowed Bellevue for them, I will take advantage of your offer to store them to Bellevue's order.

Regarding Laidman, I am writing requesting him to deposit in the Bank of Commerce, Vernon, to the credit of Bellevue \$44.50, being \$32.50 for oats and \$12. for 2 tons of roots.

Regarding Vernon Fruit Union, I am writing asking them to send me a statement of the Bellevue account as it stands at present, showing the balance due them, which I will pay from here, providing it corresponds with the amounts as given me by you and Lambert.

Regarding Vernon Growers Limited, as you were with me when we saw the manager of this Company (I forget his name) will you kindly telephone to him and ask him to deposit the amount due Bellevue Ranch in the Bank of Commerce, Vernon, without further delay. You may recall that he promised to do this as soon as he got his statements from Kelowna, which I understood would be in a few days. If you will telephone to him and see that this is deposited, I would appreciate it.

Re Coldstream Municipality, they have already deposited with the Bank of Commerce \$11.80, the amount of their indebtedness to Bellevue Ranch.

My reference to additional equipment purchased during the year, was because I recalled an amount of \$30. which Lambert had paid to a man named Gallon for equipment purchased, which does not appear in the inventory. I do not know at this time whether there were any others, but this one I am certain of.

Regarding express on 4 boxes of apples to me, \$10.80, the last thing you said to me when I left you at Okanagan Centre was that the Rainbow Ranch would pay this, charging me with it, and I wish you would put it through in this way.
