RE RAINBOW RANCH.

Referring to your letter of the 2nd inst, I expect you are right, that we might as well give up expecting to see Mr. Dormer during this calendar year, and if you will bring all the data East with you, we can go over the whole situation then, and must try and arrange that we all get together on the ground some time early next year.

I note by the bank statement recently received, that the Ranch account is credited with \$1,000. on October 31st. This I presume is the payment from the Fruit Union referred to in your letter.

Regarding changes to the house, you know my opinion of the place. With all the money we have spent on it, it is still quite uninhabitable in cold weather, and if you can make it habitable on the lines described in your letter, by all means do so. It is alright to use the quarters which were built by Hewer for Dormer, for the purpose you intimate. This original building was done without my knowledge, and as I think I have said before, there is no reason why special quarters should be built and set apart for Dormer any more than for myself. The element of doubt I have regarding the house, is that no matter what is done to it, it cannot be made satisfactory, and there is a possibility of the money being, so to speak, thrown away.

I will look forward to hearing from you as soon as you have all your returns in.
