My dear Jim:

I have your letter of the 20th with copy of letter to you from Mr. E. Henderson, Municipal Clerk, dated the 17th, and your reply of the 19th. Your reply, in conjunction with his letter to you, covers the matter fully, and by the time this reaches you I presume it will be closed, which would be quite satisfactory to me.

The east and west road is certainly contingent upon the arrangement with the municipal government regarding the Bessette Road. I am in some doubt as to whether the land upon the west boundary at present occupied by the Bessette Road can be legally deeded to me, but this point should be made as strong as possible, and we will take the best title that they can give us.

I have not yet received the letter you sent to Toronto re financing Rainbow, but take it that the Royal Bank will not give us the terms we want. I expect to be in Toronto about the end of this week, and will then see Mr. Laird of the Bank of Commerce, and try to arrange with him. Will immediately let you know whether I am able to accomplish anything.
