
Dear Mr. Goldie:

RE BELLEVUE RANCH.

I am advised by the Bank of Commerce at Vernon that \$17.85 has been deposited to my credit by Messrs Billings & Cochrane. I have requested the Bank to credit this to Bellevue Ranch, and from a letter received from Messrs Billings & Cochrane I understand this covers a second payment of \$20, from Thomas; the balance, I take it, being their commission and exchange on the money. Will you therefore credit the Thomas indebtedness with \$20, and charge commissions \$2.00 and exchange 15¢, the balance, \$17.85, having been turned in to the Ranch in cash. This makes no change in the total of my cash advances to Bellevue, which, allowing for the Thomas first payment received here, now amount to \$35,702.61. Please let me know if this corresponds with your books. ^{correct}
