Dear Mr. McAllister :-

Under separate cover I am sending you another batch of Associated letters. They help to give one a picture of the fruit deal. You might send them on to Dormer. He will be interested in some of the remarks about the Export deal.

I have had a letter from Dormer suggesting that we might do some good business over there by trucking direct from the Point of Landing to the retail stores. The motor truck has broken up the regular channels of trade in the fruit business both in Ontario and also and more so in the United States. There must be some reason why it does not now work in Britain.

E.C.Chambers the President of The Associated Growers called me on the Phone to day asking for your address. He says that he may want to see you when in Toronto in the near future. He did not say what his subject is. I do not know whether you have met him or not, but he is a pretty good sort and without doubt knows more about our fruit deal than anyone else in the Valley.

The Copy of the Companies Act was for you, I also sent one to Dormer.

I have just noticed that I have not replied to your letter of the 7th of Jan. I will write you again about it.
