Dear Jim:-

I have received your letter of the 6th inst., enclosing letter from Messrs. Muir, Jephson & Adams, which I now return herewith.

In conversation with Mayhew yesterday, he stated that the transfer for lots 9, 10, 11 and 12, Block 116, Plan A1, from F. C. Burch, (present registered owner,) was in one of the banks with ~~the~~ a draft for \$2,000 attached to it.

Mayhew stated that the understanding was, that he was to have transfer for these 4 lots at any time he cared to take up the draft within the next six months. Mayhew has made out the transfer for your two lots 9 and 10, from himself to you, and he has attached this to the draft on you which he is putting through to-day. He will then go to the bank and secure transfer for the 4 lots and have these registered, so that by the time you return your transfer to ^{me} ~~him~~, the title will be perfectly clear, and your transfer can be registered, and the clear title made out.

I hope you will see your way clear to come back here within the next month or so, as I feel confident that it will be to your interest to do so. Of course I realize it must be very hard for you to get into a stiff collar again, but if you cannot come any other way, well come in your ranch togs.
