RE BELLEVUE RANCH.


Your letters of the 21st and 24th inst received, and I return herewith form of application for water, which I have signed. You can fill in the blanks as required.

I note Lambert's letters, and also what he is doing, and will write him within the next two or three days. I would like, however, to receive from you as soon as possible, the statement for the year, to correspond with the statement formerly rendered by Riddell, Stead & Hodges. As soon as I receive this, with your comments, I will be able to write Lambert intelligently. What I am most anxious to know is what the outlay on Bellevue is liable to be this year until its revenue is coming in. In other words, what money is absolutely necessary to be provided.

I note Lambert's letter to you re use of our irrigation pipes to supply Osborne and Russell with water, and quite agree with your reply to him. I will write him myself along this line, telling him that if there is revenue to be made out of allowing their water to be fed through this pipe without possible injury to the same, it would be alright for him to make such an arrangement, but it must be a business proposition, and if they take water through the pipe they have got to pay a rental for the same, which will be suitable to the cost of the installation.

As soon as I hear from you fully regarding Bellevue affairs, I will establish regular communication with Lambert on his operations.
