George being away on his holiday I sent your accident policy to Anson H. Campbell and he returned a new policy #3194521 for which we remitted him less \$16.66 cancellation on the old policy. We have looked wa the safe but cannot find any Masonic certificates, nor do they know anything about them at the Gore.

Enclosed you will find receipt for whitewash this we understand is the American Government standard.

We have not had for many years such a demand for flour as is now on. We have been a week to ten days behind orders, with all the mills running fill time. Everybody is crying out for flour and stocks are very light even with all the sales. I had a trip around with Prichard which took three weeks. Things look very favorable to us and the advertising is certainly apprediated and is creating demand for STAR from points that we have never heard from before. I had many enquiries for you, so many that I cannot now tell from whom. We are paying \$1.00 for wheat which is about 2¢ less than we can buy \$1 Northern at the Lake Ports, which means that the two kinds of flour are going to come closer together in price. We are selling on the basis of \$5.50 St. John freights, with feed at \$26. and \$23.50.

All the people at home are well.
