I enclose a draft agreement re the right of  
way through my meadow which, if it meets with your

With regard to the gates, if you like, I will put these both  
<sup>(inclusive of all labour & material)</sup>  
in for \$8.50. <sup>the two</sup> As I have the lumber here and can get the  
posts cut & hauled.

With reference to your <sup>friend</sup> Hay, Baker (whom you have met  
& who has been hitherto working for me) & Jack Grady say  
that they will stack it in two stacks (as you desire)  
for \$1.75 per ton, but could not do it for less. They would  
like to start in on it at once, <sup>if you want it done</sup> so please ride over & settle with  
them on Sunday or send word on that day.

I enclose a leaf from an agric. Report which gives you the  
various ways of calculating the number of tons in a stack.  
You would have to agree with them on one of these methods  
of calculating the amount.

I am riding to Town tonight & shall not be back before  
next Wednesday.

I hope the ladies were not tired after their expedition to  
Wood's Lake.
