Dear Sirs:-

I delayed writing to Mr. Ellison because I knew he was away; ^{but} ~~and~~ I have recently sent him a letter demanding payment of the amount mentioned in the memo you left with me, and Mr. Johnston has called to see me about the matter on Mr. Ellison's behalf. Mr. Johnston considers that the items in the bill are excessive, but he has authorized me to say that if you will accept the actual amount of the damage to the fence, that is, the actual cost of labor and materials required for repairing same, together with the actual cost of feeding the cattle (which he claims should not exceed \$1. per month per head), and the sum of \$1.50 for advertising, the amount thus ascertained ^{will} ~~would~~ be paid.
