

Hitler Confiscates Wenatchee Man's Inheritance

WENATCHEE, Nov. 26.—
(AP)—Capt. Paul Stoffel, apple grower, inherited 30,000 worth of good German marks, but he won't get a cent of it, he said.

A great-uncle in Germany left him 150,000 marks. But Stoffel was advised, the German Government collected the legacy, because:

He ran away from Germany when he was 13 years old to escape compulsory military training; more than \$25 in money can not be taken from the country, and, besides, he has been an American citizen for many years.

"I always wanted to inherit some money and see how it felt," Stoffel explained. "Now I know."
