Received your letter of the 27th & was quite surprised to hear you was fruit farming in B.C.

In regards to the oats & hay I can get the timothy hay for ^{just ton} \$15.50 & as for the oats I have a car load for sale myself if you want them loose in the car I can put them in at 30¢ per bus or if you want them sacked 35¢ per bus they are fine oats good enough for oat meal & weigh between 40 & 50 lbs to the bus measure. I have no timothy hay but was speaking to a hay

dealer in town I told him you wanted it strictly first class & he said he had it nice & bright & not too coarse he claims he paid the farmers \$15.00 a ton for it. I think I can get you all the prairie upland hay you want for \$9.00 per ton. If you desire any more I think I could get ^{any} quantity you desire.

Folks are all well. My brother Geo is in Calgary Head Miller for The Western Milling Co.

I have often thought of you & the two days shooting we had when you was here.
