
Re Improvement District

Upon consideration of the matter of the flume through the Reserve, I came to the conclusion that rather than draw a formal agreement it would be better to write to the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs and obtain a letter from him consenting to the arrangement. The Agreement could then be drawn in accordance with the contents of my letter and any further suggestions the Superintendent-General may wish to make. The Agreement is a very simple one but the Superintendent-General might think we were presuming quite a lot if we sent the Agreement completed by us. It may be that they will not execute a formal agreement but will give us a letter agreeing to the arrangement "at the will of the Superintendent-General". This was what they did at

Keremeos in connection with a Right-of-Way matter I had before me some time ago.

The Indian Agent did not call at Mr Norrington's office to-day and I am holding the original letter to the Superintendent-General and the copy for the Indian Agent pending the arrival of the Agent. I enclose a copy for your information. You might let me have your views on this matter.
