Minutes of a meeting of "Flume" Committee held at the residence of Mr. J. E. Seaton, at Winfield, Thursday evening, August 6th 1931.

Present, Mesers. Seaton, Phillips, Powley and Goldie, and the Secretary.

Copies of the minutes of the meeting of August 1st having been furnished to all members of the committee, it was

Moved by Mr. Seaton. Seconded by Mr. Phillips, That the minutes of August 1st be adopted.

Mr. Goldie reported his progress with the canvass of the individual water users, and advised that in his opinion this had progressed to point where it was reasonable to assume that the support was sufficient to warrant the committee in proceeding with the construction of the flume.

Mr. Seaton reported that in accordance with authority given him at the last meeting, he had ordered the main part of the lumber required as specified by the engineer. A discussion ensued on the best method of delivery, etc.

Mr. Goldie reported that he had interviewed Mr. Marshall of the Okanagan Centre Irrigation & Power Company, who had promised to give the domnittee a letter authorising the removal of part of the present by-pass to commect with the proposed flume; Mr. Marshall stipulates that the same type of construction as used in the present location of the by-pass be used in its new location. Mr. Marshall also expressed his willingness to arrange for new agreement re right of way across the Indian Reserve.

Mr. Seaton reported conversation with Mr. Cushing, Fublic Torks Engineer, re road crossings; Mr. Cushing would like these culverts to be two feet underground; application forms to be filed for this work.

Mr. Seaton reported that Mr. Cameron had advised that he could secure sufficient concrete pipe for the road crossings at the following prices, 16" @ \$2.08 per foot, and 16%" @ \$2.45 per foot. It was decided to get price from Pacific Pipe Company on welded steel pipe for this work.

The matter of installing two outlets for Mr. Phillips property was discussed and it was moved by Mr. Powley.

Seconded by Mr. Seaton. That in view of the acreage to be served and the fact that Mr. Phillips is eliminating one gate crossing, the committee are in favor of installing two outlets on Mr. Phillips property.

Mr. Seaton delivered two sealed tenders, which were opened by the secretary and submitted to the committee, as follows-

Mr. J. McDonald, \$819.00 for all labor building flume and moving by-pass, except siphons and crossings.

Lodge & Duggan, \$11.00 per M.B.ft of lumber plus \$100.00 for clearing and ditching.

Paterson & Black, 15 cents per lineal feet of flume plus 12 cents per foot of by-paseto be moved.

Attached note shows comparison of above figures as worked out by the committee. after due consideration, it appeared to the committee that the Lodge-Dussan tander was the west advantageous, and Mr. Scaton was instructed to interview these parties and get further detail on the following points, viz. - Commection with siphons, building "Gross-overs", m ving Ly-pass, concrete box at turn of by-pass.

A discussion ensued on the need of using reeks under cills, and it was decided that this was not necessary. Other patters in connection with construction were left to Mr. Sector to take with the engineer and the tenderer.

The meeting then adjourned.
