

Meeting of the Trustees of Winfield & Okanagan Centre Irrigation District held in the Rainbow Ranche office Fri. Mar. 15/46 at 2 p.m.

Seconded by BERRY :- That the minutes of the Court of Revision held on November 14, 1945 be adopted. CARRIED

Seconded by CONSTABLE :- That the minutes of the meeting of November 14, 1945 be adopted. CARRIED

Arising from the minutes the Secretary read a letter written to the OK. Centre Irrigation & Power Co. which said that the Trustees thought far too much water had been used last season. An answer from the Co. was read in which it was suggested that the District and the Co. should get together and try to keep a closer watch on the water supplied to the Eldorado Ranch.

The chairman reported that it looked as though the Eldorado intended to use the top of the new dam as a bridge for their cattle. The Sec. was instructed to notify Mr. VanAckeren and to see what could be done to stop this practice.

CORRESPONDENCE The Sec. read a letter from the Assn. of B. C. Irrigation Districts which said that the Assn. had decided to assess each district 2¢ per irrigable acre.

Seconded by CONSTABLE :- that the District continue their membership of the Assn. and agree to the new assessment.

Three letters applying for domestic water connections were then read. (All three were in OK. Centre) This started quite a discussion. It was finally decided to meet each application as it came up (as has been done in the past) but that an initial fee would be charged. Messrs. Berry & Constable voted for a charge of \$75.00 and Messrs, Duggan & Goldie for \$50.00. The chairman cast his vote in favour of \$50.00 so \$50.00 WAS SET AS THE FEE FOR INSTALLATIONS ON ALL FUTURE DOMESTIC CONNECTIONS. ON "B" LAND.

It was then decided to grant connections to all three applicants.
