The matter was discussed, but no action was taken.

The part of the 1916-17 calendar dealing with (1) Registration, (2) Attendance, (3) Examinations in Arts and (4) Examinations in Applied Science was presented, and attention was called to the points in which it differed from that of 1915016. The following clause in the second paragraph under Examinations in Arts was discussed.

"Students failing in more than two subjects at the Christmas examinations will be required to discontinue attendance for the remainder of the session."

Dr. Pearson and Mr. Wade.

"That this clause be amended by adding the

clause, "unless for special reasons, the Faculty decides to direct otherwise".

The motion was put to vote by the Chairman and was lost.

- (55) The President suggested that the dates of Senate meetings should appear in the calendar.
- (56) Under (4) Examinations in Applied Science, second and third paragraphs, it was ordered that the word "full" be stricken from the phrase "major full subjects", wherever it appears.

In the second paragraph under Examinations in Applied Science, the clause "Any partial student of the first year who fails in the Christmas examinations will not be allowed to continue his course, except under special circumstances and with the consent of the Faculty", was discussed.

Calendal

"That the clause be amended to read: 'That any partial student of the first year who fails in the Christmas examinations in any subject will not be allowed to continue his course in that subject!".

The motion was put and lost.

It was agreed that the clause should read as follows:

"That any partial student of the first year who fails in the Christmas examinations in any subject will not be allowed to continue his course in that subject, except under special circumstances and with the consent of the Faculty".
