W. Kaye Lamb Memorial Library Fund established

Elizabeth Hawkins recently established a memorial fund in memory of her father, Dr. W. Kaye Lamb. Dr. Lamb was UBC Librarian from 1940-1948 and became Canada's first National Librarian in 1953. He was also Dominion Archivist from 1948 until he retired in 1968. The current National Librarian, author Roch Carrier, presented the inaugural W. Kaye Lamb Memorial Lecture June 4 in the Dodson Room entitled *A Library for the Nation*.

The Library's Strategic Communications Plan

Marleen Morris and Associates has been working closely with Catherine Quinlan and Allison Markin, the Library's Communications Co-ordinator, on the development of a strategic communications plan for the Library. This work will continue through the summer and will result in a comprehensive plan targeting our key audiences. Marleen continues to conduct research both within the Library and externally with other groups and individuals on campus in order to assess our communications needs and develop the best possible program.

Beginning later this summer and in the fall, you will see parts of this plan 'roll out', including: a visual identity program, the formation of a Library-wide communications committee, a comprehensive faculty orientation program and the development of events for our on-campus and off-campus user communities. Asian Heritage Month event draws crowd



On May 18, Asian Library staff successfully hosted a full-day event in celebration of Asian Heritage Month and welcomed representatives from 12 Chinese pioneer families. Participants attended talks on Chinese rare books, Sikh family names and CJK e-resources. Asian Library recorded traffic of over 750 persons that Saturday, more than 10 times the gate count on regular weekends.

Other news from the Asian Library includes the move of all the Asian titles in the Swann Collection back to the Asian Library in April. Patrons can check the list of items in a manually compiled catalogue at the Circulation Desk. Since March, library computers have been able to display Chinese, Japanese and Korean vernaculars and patrons have access to MagazinePlus, an online index to 8,500 Japanese journals and periodicals.

Library receives funding

Good news! The UBC Library recently received \$50,000 to help fund library instruction programs. This one time funding is the equivalent to the TLEF grant the Library received in past years for the Information Connections program. This money was allocated to the Library from funds for the indirect cost of research and tuition fee increase.

STAFF TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Staff Training and Development Program announces the Library Overview Series for Fall 2002, with four new workshops. This training series will be mandatory for all new staff members and available to incumbents as space permits. The core topics in the series are:

- Computer literacy orientation
- Library health & safety orientation
- Communication with customers and colleagues (new)
- Library web site/University of B.C. web site (new)
- Technical services/Online library system overview (new)
- Circulation, with Finale: Strategic plan, mission, values (new)

Generally, staff members are recruited for a specific function or service and will learn these functions/services in-depth within the unit or department. This structured training program at the overview level proposes to broaden everyone's general knowledge about the Library's services and functions. Its other goals are to contribute to a common understanding of the Library's mission and goals, to foster cross-unit understanding and fertilization and to improve communication skills with customers and colleagues.

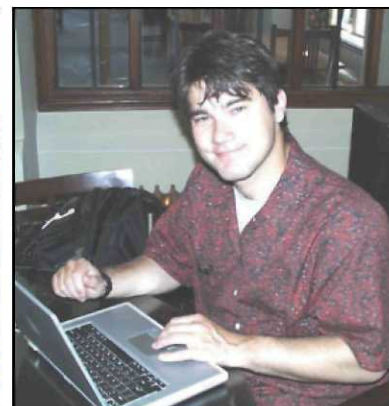
