The source was a space heater which was connected to a wall outlet by an extension cord; the wall outlet was covered up by a pile of old office files in cardboard cartons. The fire detection system alerted the Fire Department and the fire was extinguished before it could reach the book collection. The office files were burnt and water-soaked, a wall was badly damaged, a glass partition cracked in the heat, and a plastic diffuser in a ceiling fluorescent fixture melted.
