Program Note

Paradox ... is an essential element in Strindberg's many-faceted plays. He perceived this himself in his famous Preface to Miss Julie, when he prided himself on supplying his character with a "multiplicity of motives: and decried old-fashioned methods of characterization that yielded only stereotypes on the stage. Paradox is inseparable in his case from depth of understanding, and it is plainly his comprehension of ambivalence and inner conflict that made him the prime creator of modern psychological drama.
