SEWERS WILL BE CONSTRUCTED ON SEVERAL STREETS

The recommendations of the city engineer for the construction of a sewer in the lane between Powell and Cordova sts; lane east of Carrall, 12th ave E and Eton st, have been approved by the Board of Works, and these works will be carried out this year. Tenders will soon be called for the construction of a sewer on Willow st, from 12th to 16th ave, and a temporary sewer on 12th ave from Willow to Laurel st. A 24-ft plank roadway will be put down on Robson st at the entrance to the Cambie st bridge, and a 16-ft plank roadway on Granville st from 2nd to 4th ave. A temporary plank roadway will be put in on Broadway from Main to Brunswick st, until paving can be resumed in the spring.

LOCAL SYNDICATE PLANS IMPROVEMENTS FOR LULU ISLAND

A local syndicate, capitalized at \$10,000,000, and called the Vancouver Harbor & Dock Extension Co., announces that it has taken options on a large amount of land on Lulu Island, Sea Island, at Elburne and along the Praeger river, and proposes to spend \$6,000,000 in various improvements, among which are a harbor, a tunnel across Pt. Grey into Kitano, where a passenger terminal will be built; freight terminals on Lulu Island; a townsite nearby, with graded streets and water and sewer system, street railway, wharves, shipping business and manufactories. It is reported that the several railroads other than the C. P. R. which now enter Vancouver and Seattle are back of the scheme.

CONDEMNED BUILDINGS MUST BE REMOVED

By a court decision, the demolition of the bldgs belonging to J. W. Horne, at 508 to 514 Cordova at W, ordered by the city, has been upheld, and in all probability the bldgs will be removed in a short time.

SEATTLE FIRM GIVEN CONTRACT

SEATTLE—The Moran Co. has been awarded the contract for the construction of two steel steam whalers for the Canadian Northern Pacific Fisheries Company of Victoria. The total contract price is \$130,000. The vessels will be 96 feet long, 18 feet beam and 11.6 feet deep. It is expected they will be ready for launching in six months.

WILL ERRECT CITY BUILDING

VICTORIA—Since the acquiring of water front adjacent to Rock Bay by the city, for city buildings, a by-law is in course of preparation to provide for the erection of stables, storehouses and other bldgs on the site.

COURT OF REVISION ON LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS

A court of revision will be held on Nov. 12 to hear complaints against the following proposed street improvements, to be carried out this year: Crooked block pavement on Robson st, Hamilton and Dunlevy from Hastings to Harris sts, with concrete foundations and curbs, estimated cost \$44,891.98, the city's share of which is \$20,001.72.

A court of revision will be held on Nov. 25 to hear complaints on the following improvements: Pave lane in blk 31, D. L. 541; widening Commercial drive to 80 ft, from Venables st to 16th ave, in two sections; opening lane in blk 37, D. L. 184, one block; and installation of standards for cluster lights on Hastings, Main, Cordova and Pender sts, and maintenance for one year of lights. Total estimated cost, \$621,218.35; city's share of which is \$8,231.70, besides damages for property in widening Commercial drive.

APARTMENTS FOR SOUTH GRANVILLE STREET

Archts. Townsend & Townsend have completed plans for two 3-story frame apartment houses to be built adjoining each other at 3046 Granville at and 1483 15th ave W, facing on two streets. The bldgs are for A. Fergusson, 1408 10th ave W, who will superintend the erection of the two bldgs. Mr. Fergusson will handle all minor contracts, and will shortly take figures for a number of them. The cost of the two bldgs will be \$40,000.

G. T. P. PLANS LARGE HOTEL FOR VICTORIA

VICTORIA—On provision that the company would be exempted from taxation, F. M. Hattenbury has reported to the council that the G. T. P. contemplates the erection of a large hotel bldg in this city, construction to start in the spring. It is probable that the railway company will be exempted for 10 years.
