## THREE WARDS FOR ALBERNI

The City of Alberni will be divided into three wards. These will be known as the South, North and West Wards, and there will be two aldermen from each ward. This motion was passed at the regular meeting of the City Council on Tuesday evening. Roughly the boundaries of these wards will be as follows:

South Ward: take in everything south of Johnston Road, the Nanaimo Road, and east of Cherry Creek, and to include Block 6, of Lot 1.

North Ward: Everything north of Johnston Road and Nanaimo Road, except Block 6, west of Cherry Creek Road, and east of Kitselas Creek, with Blocks 3A, 6, 9, 12, and 14 of District Lot 11.

West Ward: Block 5, Lot 1, and all west of Somas River and Kitselas Creek, and the remainder of District Lot 11.

Mr. J. G. C. Wood, M.P.P., reported to the Council that he had investigated several of the matters which he had been requested to look into. In the first place the 300 inches of water received on the Stamp River was for domestic purposes only, and could not be used for power by the city. As to the matter of the special legislation required to enable the city to enter into a contract with the power company, it appeared that there might be a way to get around this by having the company charter so worded as to give the company power to sell to the city. There was a very good legal opinion that this would qualify the city to do business with the company without any special act in the matter. Some of the aldermen were rather doubtful of this, and the question will be taken up with the city solicitor.

## POWER PROBLEMS AGAIN DEBATED

A special meeting of the City Council was held on Friday evening for the purpose of considering the letter of the Ritchie-Agnew Power Company. In reply to the communication from the Council and the results of the public meeting held recently, the text of the letter from the power company has already appeared in the Advocate, and it can be taken for granted that the majority of our readers are sufficiently familiar with the matter to need no repetition of that document. To this the Council replied with a statement of the various points which in their opinion needed attention before the negotiations could proceed further. This brought another letter from the power company, and to this the Council resolved to reply as follows:

Sirs, I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th inst. in reply to certain objections to the agreement put forward by the City Council in a letter to you on the 11th instant. Last night's sitting the Council took up your reply clause by clause and now authorise me to forward you their reconsideration of the former objections in relation to your reply of the 18th inst. Their further opinion on those objections is as follows:



## STAGGERING LOAD FOR PROVINCE

According to the Vancouver Sun it has been stated in inner circles that the legislative assembly will be called together early in January for the purpose of considering three important measures in relation to southern matters. Those three measures are as follows:

1. To provide further large sum of money in aid of Mackenzie & Mann and their Canadian Northern enterprise.

The amount they must have in order to enable them to finish their undertakings in this province is not less than \$25,000,000.

### TO FINISH RAILWAY.

2. To provide further money for Mackay, Polley, Welsh & Stewart, and their Vancouver associates to enable them to finish the Pacific Great Eastern Railroad to Port George. The further amount necessary in this case is vastly estimated, but it will not be less than \$16,000,000.

3. To authorize the McBride government to borrow for various provincial purposes sums of money totaling not less than \$15,000,000.

### INFORMATION AUTHENTIC.

This information, the Sun has been assured, may be accepted as authentic. The above programme is in contemplation by the premier and his cabinet at the present moment, and unless their plans misfire will be carried into effect.

Taking into account the guarantees already on the statute books and assuming that those contemplated will be made, the Province of British Columbia will have a staggering load of liabilities amounting to \$100,000,000 all of which have been incurred in a little over three years.

### Winter Schedule.

The E. & N. H. R. has announced a winter schedule as follows:

Commencing on Monday, Dec. 2nd, the company will run through trains between Victoria and Alberni on alternate days only. Trains will leave Alberni at 11:30 a.m., on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays and will arrive from Victoria at 4:15 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. This schedule will remain in force for the winter months.


