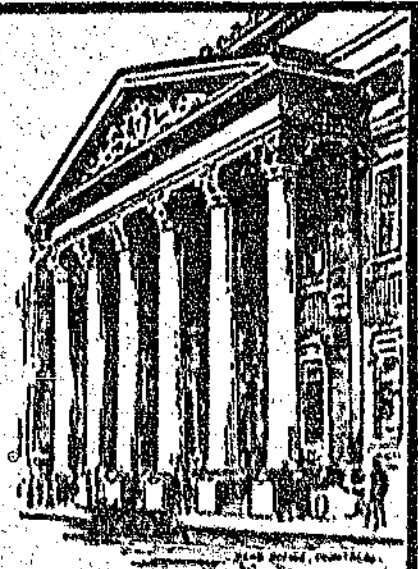

WAR PROGRESS

IN PARAGRAPHS

Petrograd, Sept. 27.—The Russians are on the offensive along a 200 mile front, and have cut von Mackenzon's line of communication in several points. Austrians in Galicia driven back.

London, Sept. 27.—The British and French have won a great victory, the British at La Bassa, and the French in Champagne. The advance was over a front of 20 miles, and to a depth of 2 to 3 miles. German losses, killed and wounded 50,000, prisoners, 20,000, making a total of 70,000 in two days. France bombarded the Belgian coast by British fleet.

Great offensive in west continues with unabated vigour.

London, Sept. 28.—The offensive on the west continues. French official reports claim fresh progress in the Champagne. The German counter efforts failed. The French are now battering the second German line in the Champagne.

Petrograd, Sept. 28.—The Russians have silenced the German batteries in the Gulf of Riga.

Despatches from Serbia believe that the projected attack has been postponed.

Reported that von Mackenzon's army has been ordered to retreat owing to a rapid enveloping movement of the Russians. All signs point to a turning point in the Russian campaign.

London, Sept. 29.—There is an unconfirmed report of a victory of sweeping magnitude for the Allies in the Dardanelles.

The great conflict in the Champagne continues today. North and South of Abbe a great artillery duel is in progress.

The British have won a great victory at Mesopotamia. The Turks are in full retreat.

French captured 1,000 Germans during the last night's fighting.

During British offensive in France Lieut. Gen. Sir Thompson Capner and Maj. Gen. C. H. Prestige were killed.

Autumn Flowers.

There is a beauty about autumn flowers that appeals to most of us, and just now they are at their best. Many of the local gardens have a good showing along these lines, and if the usual Fall Fair was under way no doubt there would be keen competition amongst the various growers of these beautiful blossoms, but there is an exhibition in town this week that is quite as beautiful. We refer to the fine showing of local meat in the family butcher shop. Some of this is certainly as beautiful as a bouquet of autumn flowers, and far more sustaining as an article of diet.

TRADE LICENSES

The matter of Trader's Licenses occupied the attention of the Council at the last regular session. It appears that there has been some objection on the part of those who are paying these licenses to the fact that others in the same line of business have not been taking out the license. The matter was discussed at some length and will be adjusted.

A number of letters on all kinds of subjects were disposed of, mostly by the convenient method of filing them for future reference.

Mr. Clegg, the local photographer, waited on the council with regard to photographs for the office of the Agent General in London. Mr. Clegg had on hand some fine specimens of his excellent work, and it was resolved to make a selection from those to send to the Old Country.

Sundry accounts were ordered paid. Reports were received regarding sundry improvements to sidewalks, work on the waterworks dam, and other small matters. A report was received from the police commissioners in re the matter of the appointment of Mr. D. H. MacKenzie as city constable, and the report was adopted. Mr. MacKenzie will undertake the care of the electric clocks, the pound regulations, sanitary inspection and other matters, as well as his regular police duties.

The postponed creamery re-organization meeting will be held next Wednesday, in the Court House, at 3 p.m.

Patriotic Chess.

The patriotic game of Living Chess given by the Beaver Lodge R.A.O.B. in the Lord-Hast Hall on Friday evening was a great success. As it was the first of the kind ever given in Alberni the show was of great interest and the various moves were watched with close attention. The children who took part in the game were all in pretty costumes, and looked very well. Several local artists took part in the programme and were well received. Songs were given by Mesdames Dinsdale and Stephens and Mr. Collinge, and a reading by Mr. Serlyener, all of which received great applause. A neat sum was realized and turned over to the Patriotic Fund.

WAKING UP.

The first part of the week was taken up with the reports of the big advance of the Allies along the Western Front. There are several accounts of the transaction but they all agree that an advance has been made along a front of over twenty miles, and for distances of from two to five miles within the German lines. Thousands of prisoners have been taken, and the newspapers are talking of this as the beginning of the expected "big drive." At the same time the Russian forces have turned on their foes, and to have given them a hard smash. This may be the answer to Bulgaria, and her flirting with the Teutonic powers. If so it can be taken for granted that Bulgaria will hesitate to join an ally that has received such a blow, and that from those who appear to be able to deal them at will.

It can also be taken for granted that once the western German line is broken to such an extent as that indicated in the recent news, it is not too much to hope that the German forces will be beyond the Rhine by the end of the year. What a fine Christmas present from the Allies to Belgium such a condition would make. A country free from the swine whose long snouts have been rooting at the very vitals of the stricken land for more than a year. That would be worth hanging up a stocking for.

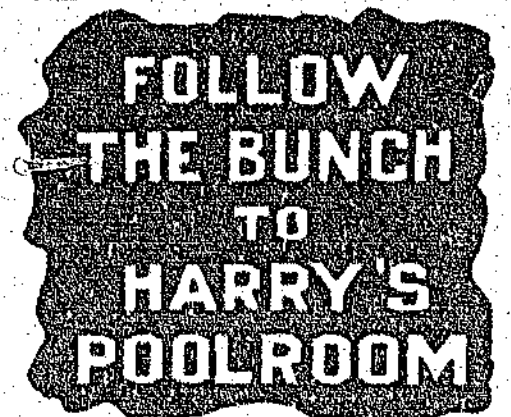
