Progress of the No. 7

SHAFT STILL SINKING.

POCKET AT 200 BEING CUT.

At the No. 7 shaft has reached the 200 level and some feet deeper for the sum.

All hands are busy cutting the station and pocket at the 200 foot level. The crosscut has been run to the ledge which was found to be strong and of full width and quite well mineralized.

On the 160 foot level in the east drift some very fine ore has recently been found, and the ledge widened to five feet.

The recent snow may make the roads good enough to begin hauling ore, although the steep grades were like a glacier and may still be too slippery for safety.

Mrs. Hamilton died quite suddenly Monday night, at the Ruby mine. She leaves several small children. Much sympathy is felt for the bereaved husband and children.
