DRIFT

Advanced 90 ft. in ore.

Mr. Keffer accompanied by Mr. V. Norden visited No. 7 on Tuesday.

They report that there is only about a foot of snow left in Central Camp, and that the road is in fairly good condition. The trail is very good. Mr. H. Johnson, who is watchman at No. 7, has advanced the drift on the 60 foot level 90 feet since the mine closed down.

With this additional work the 60 foot level extends nearly the full length of the claim and is in ore all the way.

The work is done along the ledge in the soft rock of the foot wall.

The Gold Finch ledge has widened from about an inch on the surface to two feet at the present workings, and some very high assays have been obtained from the Providence.
