Slag Railway.

Nearly finished at the Sunset smelter.

At the Boundary Falls smelter both furnaces are running full blast.

The tracks for the slag railway have been in place for some time. All the cars are in, and they expect to commence operations in a week if all goes well. The cars will need to be raised a little. With this exception they work well.

The third furnace has been taken from the railway where it was unloaded and moved to the furnace floor in readiness to be set up. The foundations have been finished for several weeks.

Three blowers are now in place. That for the third furnace is set up and ready for use, so no delay in starting the new furnace will result from this source.

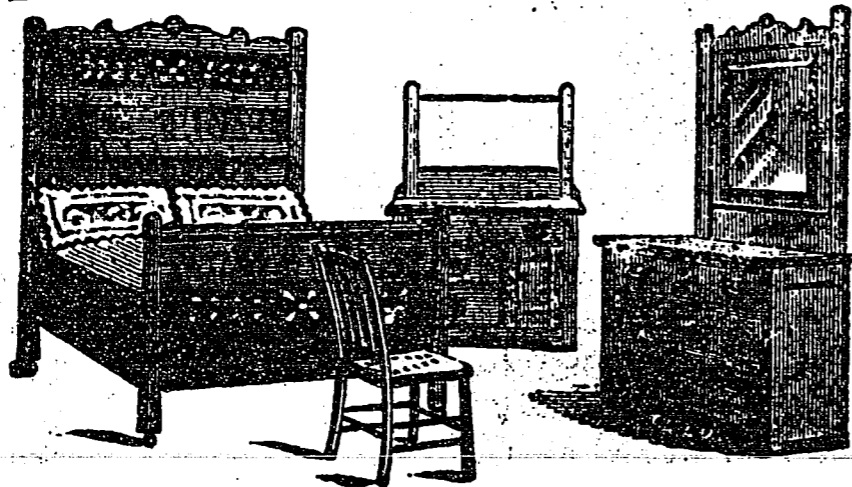
