Converter

Machinery Nearly All in.

At the B. C. Copper Co's smelter a great deal of converter machinery has been received. The tracks for the big traveling crane are in place, and the trucks for the same have been lifted on to the tracks. A large and heavy derrick has been put up in readiness to lift the body of the crane and other machinery into position. Several pots for conveying molten matte and copper have arrived, also some iron girders and beams. All the converter parts are in. A temporary railway has been built to carry machinery from the C. P. R. cars to the back of the converter building. Several ingot cars are here for carrying and loading copper. The electric motor for the big crane is in, also several other kinds of electrical ma-

chinery.

The work of unloading and erecting this machinery will be rushed. All the foundations are finished, both in the converter and new electrical engine room.

At the Providence.

At the Providence rich ore has been struck on the 300 foot level. It is turning out a fine mine, and will now be able to ship a car per week of rich silver-gold ore.

The Elkhorn is shipping rich ore regularly to the Trail smelter.

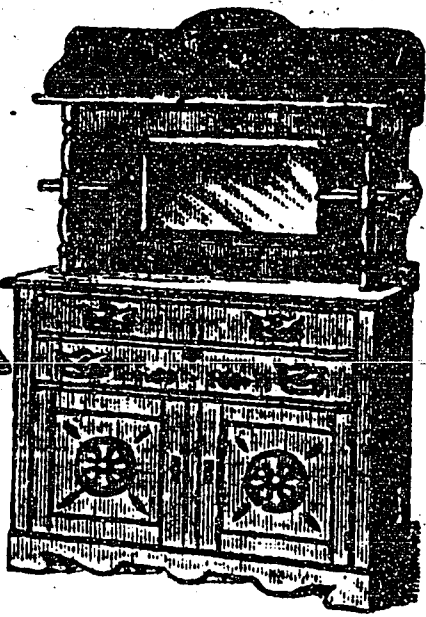
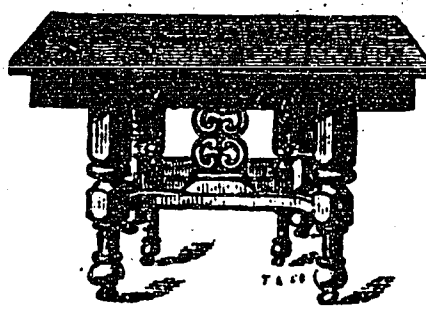
At the E. P. U. they have a fine lead of rich ore, but on account of the roads being washed out, shipments to the smelter here will be delayed for a short time.
