BIG WRECK

Shay Engine & 23 Ore Cars Smashed.

A wreck occurred at Denoro City yesterday morning in which one of the three shay locomotives operating on the Grand Forks-Phoenix line and 23 loaded ore cars were completely destroyed.

The loaded train of 24 cars was descending a very steep grade some distance above the Oro Denoro mine when for some reason the air brakes failed to operate. The hand brakes were then tried but proved insufficient to hold the train. As a last resort the engine was reversed. The result of this was that the cogs were torn off of the driver wheels leaving nothing to hold the cars. The train then rushed down the steep grade and the engine jumped the track on a sharp curve. It was torn to small pieces and twenty-three

cars piled up on top of it. A small mountain of ore was thrown on the track in front of the engine and quantities mixed up with the wreck of the train. The train, with the exception of two cars, is a total loss.

WATER FAMINE

May be had in Boundary Towns.

Many Boundary towns are short of water, on account of the prolonged dry spell. For over a month not a drop of rain has fallen in this district, and for the entire summer there has been an unusual scarcity of rain.

Boundary Creek is now five inches below low water mark and other creeks are correspondingly low.

Phoenix has been threatened with water famine for some time, and Nelson and Rossland are both short. Greenwood has not yet felt the effects of the

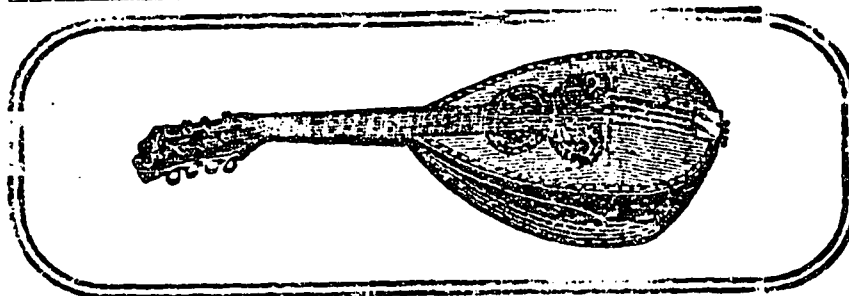
