WATER SHORTAGE

Seriously Affects Smelters, Mines and Towns in the Boundary.

A general shortage of water prevails at present in all the interior of British Columbia. This shortage is due to the extreme dry weather last summer immediately followed by freezing. Practically no rain has fallen in the Boundary Creek district since last June or July.

The present extreme cold snap (coldest in three years) with the thermometer at -18 here has brought on a crisis.

The electric power plant at Cascade with a normal capacity of 2000 H. P. has barely enough water to run one 1000 H. P. turbine about two thirds full capacity. This necessitates closing down much machinery at mines and smelters. Those fortunate enough to

have auxiliary steam plants are firing up boilers. There is not much hope of a thaw sufficient to raise streams before spring.

Three large tank cars are being used by the C. P. R. to supply their water tanks in Eholt and Phoenix. Water for domestic use in the above mentioned towns is so scarce that the citizens are hoping for the unlikely in the shape of a February thaw.

Mr. Naden Renominated.

On Monday Mr. Geo. R. Naden was renominated for mayor of Greenwood. As the nomination was unanimous and there is no other candidate it is equivalent to an election.

Mr. Naden's work has been most satisfactory. The bonded debt of the city was decreased by \$30,000.00 in the last term of his office.

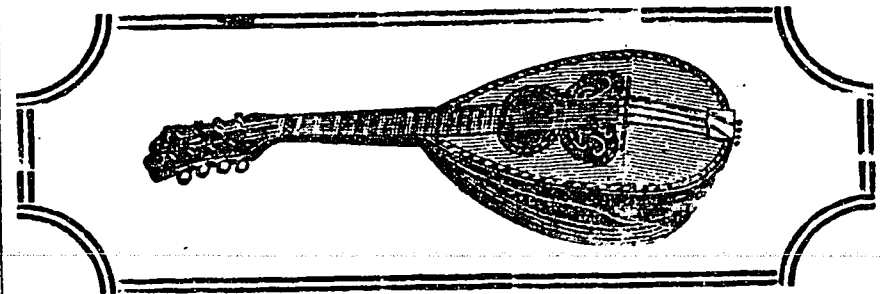

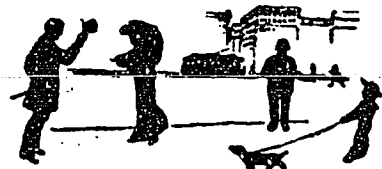
