## ITALIAN SHIP <br> FOUNDERED

Over Four Hundred Immigrants Drowned.

WERE BOUND FOB BUENOS A YRES.
CaptaIn and Crew Under Arrest ror Abaindoning the Vessel.

Cartagenia, Spain, Aug. 8.-The Italian Navigation Co's. steamer Sirio, from Genoa and bound for Buenos Ayres with over eigbt bindred emigrants aboard, foundered near this port yesterday morning and over four humdred of the passengers were drowned. When the vessel was about to sink there was a panic among the officers and crew, who seized the remaining boats and left a large number of women and childreis to their fate.
Cartagenia, Spain, Aug. 9.-An official enquiry will be made by the naval authorities into the wrecking of the Italian steamer Sirio and it is expected that the investigation will lead to severe action on the part of the commissioners against those who are clained to have been di: rectly responsible for the disaster: The captain and most of the crew of the illfated sbip have been placed under arrest.
Cowes, Aug. 9--Sir Maurice Fitzgerald's yawl Satanita wou Emperor William's cup. Lieut. Col. Bagot's cutter Creelew was second in an exciting finish.
Chicago, Aug 9.-The first detailed statement ever made public of the indebtedness of Zion city was given out at a meeting of the investigators last night. The statement showed that the total contracted debt of Zion city amounts to nearly fue million dollars, which sum it is proposed by Overseer Voliva to pay by funding the entire indebtedness for a period of eighteen years with bonds bearing six per cent. interest.
Los Angeles, Cal., August $9 .-$ Harry Baker, of San Francisco, got the decision over Frankie Neal in a twenty reund bont before the Pacific Athletic Club of this city last wight. Denver, Col, Aut. 10, George Ordway, an election commissioner, and Henry Dougherty; president of the Gas \& Electric Company of this city, were sent to jail today for contempt of court in refusing to testify in an election contest. The former also refused to deliver the ballot boxes to the sheriff.
Philadelphia, Aug to, Five maritiers are in double irous aboard the receiving ship Lancaster at the League Island navy yard and ten sailors are under arrest as the result of a mutiny which occurred at the latter place on Monday night. Ten mutiveers were badly injured by those engaged in quelling the outbreak.
Chicago, Aug. to. The federal grand jury yesterday afternoon returned an indictment agaiust the Standard Oil Company charging it with having illegally received rebates on storage charges from several different railroad companies.

Stolypin, the premier, was in conference with the czar all Friday niggat. He is displeased with the appointment of a dictator It is fully expected that the premier will resign because of the assumption of complete power by Grand Duke Nicholas.
If the troops that are now assigned as unfaithful by the, revolutionists prove to be as predicted, St. Petersburg will be in their hands within a few days.

Daniel Guggeitheim and wife, S.A. Guggenbeim and vife, all of New York, D. A. Anderson and wife, of Tdaho, who lave large fortune invested in the, mining and smetting business in Cauada and the United States, acconpanied by A. Chester Beatty mining engineer of Denver, Col., and S. H. Graves. president of the W, P\& \& 1 R. arrived in Atlin on Sunday morning per the Scotia. They were met by Mr. O, B Perry, manager of their operations in Atlin and the Yukon, Mr. Bloomfield Smith, of London, who is building the line of railway betweetl Dawson and the Forks, and Mr O. T.
