BOULDER CREEK.

Societe Miniere Brings Down
Another Sack of Gold.

Will Continue Work all Winter.
Several Tunnels to be Driven
From Bed-rock.

Last Tuesday another well filled sack of gold came down from the Societe Miniere's hydraulic mine on Boulder, and more is expected today.

It is gratifying to note that this company has at last got down to actual pay and looks forward to a big clean-up; our prediction of last week re dividends, seems to be well warranted.

As soon as the gold has been recovered from the boxes in the final clean-up for this season, work will be started on a new sluice, necessary for the conducting of larger operations next year.

The Societe will operate all winter, it is their intention to drift into the benches from bed-rock by means of a series of tunnels.

Mr. E. Janne De Lamare, the father of the Company, leaves on Monday for Paris, we are sorry to see our "Big Parisien" go and will be pleased to welcome him back.

THE BOUNDARY.

Searching For Boundary
Monuments.

Lieut. Emmons May Visit Atlin. Is
Now at Taku Inlet.

A systematic search for the supposed Russian monuments, set on the boundary line between Great Britain and Canada, is being made by Lieut. Emmons. He is now in Taku Inlet searching its head, and as he will go through Bennett it is more than probable that he will come through Atlin, via the Skoklahene and south end of Atlin Lake.

COPPER.

Experts Making Examination
of Laverdiere Mine.

Mr. J. J. O'Meara accompanied by Mr. C. A. Molson, came in on the last boat. They left immediately for the south end of the lake where they will examine and report on the Laverdiere copper mine bonded by Mr. John Caprice, of Montana. We understand that if the report is favorable the property will be purchased at once, and extensive operations commenced.

MONRO MOUNTAIN.

Will Ship Ore Next Week For
Complete Treatment.

New Workings Expose Body of
Rich Rock. Expect to Strike
Rich Chute in Tunnel.

Work is steadily going on at the Imperial Mine, Monro Mountain, and the ore being obtained is still maintaining the high values referred to in our last issues. In the new workings recently opened up the ledge is over four feet wide and at ten feet from the outcrop some very rich rock is being exposed, the vein is compact and well defined with smooth solid footwall and shows every indication of carrying down to the No. 1 Tunnel 100 feet below where it will strike the rich chute discovered at that level.

The ore now being raised is much more mineralized than in the former workings and although high values are visible in free gold it has been demonstrated by local tests that the ore also contains values that cannot be entirely recovered by any free milling process. Ore is now being sacked, and several tons will be shipped out next week to some metallurgical works for complete treatment, and thus ascertain the full values present and also the best process adapted for further operations.

NARROW ESCAPE.

Govt. Recorder E. J. Thain
Nearly Crushed to Death.

Has His Leg Broken Above The
Knee.

On Wednesday evening Mr. E. J. Thain accompanied by Mr. Anderson went fishing off the rocks above the Anaconda mine. Mr. Thain in casting caught his fly in some brush on the cliff, and in climbing to release it he dislodged a boulder weighing about 500 lbs. before he had time to jump aside the boulder struck him knocking him into the lake, had the rock struck him on shore he would have been killed, as it was his leg is broken above the knee. Mr. Anderson helped him ashore and came to Atlin for assistance, which was speedily procured.

He was taken to the Hospital where Dr. Young set the broken limb, and, from latest information, he is resting easily, but it will be six weeks or two months before he will be about.

The Board of Trade wasted no time about taking up the suggestion put forth in our editorial of the 9th. inst. and the following letter was addressed to the Minister of Mines.

ATLIN DISTRICT BOARD OF TRADE.

Atlin, B. C.
August 20th, 1902.

To the Hon.
The Minister of Mines,
Victoria, B. C.

Sir,

I am instructed by the Board of Trade to inform you that at a recent meeting the matter of a thorough examination of the District of Atlin was brought up and vigorously discussed.

The only official report made of the Atlin District, is one compiled by Mr. W. F. Robertson in 1900 after a stay of a few days in the in the District. This report has been proved not only erroneous but utterly valueless to those to whom such reports are indispensable.

We therefore deem that in justice to the District and the Dominion at large, that owing to the extensive developments made and prospecting done in the District since the report of the Mineralogist in 1900, a new and exhaustive report should be made by a competent Mineralogist appointed by the Provincial Government for that purpose.

We would therefore respectfully urge upon you the justice of the claim, and ask that immediate steps be taken to rectify the present misleading report which you have in your Department.

What we, in Atlin, require is reliable and authentic information respecting the possibilities and actualities of our District, we fear nothing, knowing as we do that our deposits are rich and only need properly advertising without booming or colouring; hence the immediate necessity of an exhaustive report by a competent mineralogist and the dissemination of such report by the Government. We may add that the report on Atlin, in the Annual Report of the Minister of Mines, is insufficient and does not do justice to our District.

Fire at Forty-Mile.

A large warehouse of the N. A. T. & T. Co., at Forty-Mile, was destroyed by fire last week; the loss is estimated at \$9,000. The Company will rebuild at once.

JAPANESE.

Joseph Chamberlain Opposes
Joseph Martin.

The Japanese question is still unsettled, although Joseph Martin, K. C., M. L. A. thinks there should be an end to legislation, and that the Province has the power to pass its own laws against Japanese immigration into the Province. The following communication to Lord Minto, from the Rt. Hon. Joseph Chamberlain, gives us to understand that the Province cannot pass such laws.

"My Lord, — With reference to my dispatch, No. 25, of even date, respecting the British Columbia Immigration Act, 1900, I have the honor to request that you will invite the serious attention of your Ministers to the question of the competence of a provincial legislature to pass such legislation.

"2. It is understood from press reports that the act is of a restrictive nature, based upon the Natal Act, and having regard to the general principles on which the British North America Act is based, it would appear that such a measure is ultra vires for any legislative body in Canada other than the Dominion Parliament.

"3. The whole scheme of the British North America Act implies the exclusive jurisdiction of the Dominion of all 'national' powers, and though the power to legislate for the promotion and encouragement of immigration into the provinces may have been properly given to the provincial legislatures, the right of entry into Canada of persons voluntarily seeking such entry is obviously a purely national matter, affecting as it does directly the relations of the Empire with foreign states.
