WITH the opening of the mining season, a new order of things came into force, and the Government Office has a new head. The change very naturally has made considerable difference in the previously existing order in the matter of the granting of "lay-overs." Hitherto, a lay-over could be granted before the opening of the season, but this season, owing to Mr. J. D. Graham's resignation coming into effect before the season he could not well grant any order which would come into effect when his successor should assume the reins of office, nor again could Mr. J. A. Fraser have exercised any powers until he actually assumed his new office. The consequence has been that not until "representation day" could lay-overs be granted, and the Government staff has had a busy week of it. We have reason to believe that actual representation on claims has been larger this season than usual.

From information, we learn that exceptionally good grounds will have to be shown why lay-overs on claims, creek or bench—especially creek—should be laid over, and that it is the intention of the Gold Commissioner to satisfy himself as to the merits of many of the cases.

July 2nd, 1902, was the opening of the fourth mining season and it is doubtless high time, if there be any value in claims, that the value should be proved, or, at least, an attempt should be made to do so. We heartily commend the Department of Mines in its decision in this matter, and though it will undoubtedly appear a hardship to some, yet the final result will be of unquestionable good to the camp as a whole.

Attention is called to an important "Notice," which has been placed upon the Notice Boards in the Government Office, notifying all who have recourse to the use of these Boards, that any notice to be posted should first be presented to the Office to be date-stamped. The effect of this notice is patent, and will in a great measure avoid dispute as to the date of the posting of such notices.

A COMMUNICATION, from one of the owners and dealing with the conditions of the leaseholds on Gold Run, is published in another column.

As the Editorial staff of "the only paper circulated here" is not infallible, mistakes or errors of judgment may sometimes be found in these columns, but if such should be to the detriment of any one, we will always be found ready to make amends.

THOSE RATES.

The \$5.50 per Ton Rate on Ore Shipments

Not Yet Confirmed by the White Pass Authorities.—Mr. A. C. Hirschfeld Asked to Confer With Intending Shippers.

It is now over two weeks since Supt. Scharshmidt paid an official visit to Atlin and expressed his opinion that his Company would be prepared to transport ore from Atlin wharf to Tacoma for the sum of \$5.50 per ton, all charges included. Upon enquiry, we have ascertained from the Local Agent that no confirmation has yet been received from the Company by him.

Mr. Hirschfeld, during his short stay in Skagway, was asked by the General Manager, Mr. A. B. Newell, to endeavor to ascertain just exactly what prospective shippers desired or expected, and if possible find out what would be the probable tonnage.

If contemplating shippers would arrange and appoint a time and place of meeting, the matter may be finally decided and brought to satisfactory settlement to mutual advantage.

LEASEHOLDER VS. PLACER.

DEAR SIR:—Your article of June 28, entitled "Leaseholder vs. Placer," is inaccurate and misleading. It is just as well, for the general benefit of the community in this belated camp, to have any statements which you may print, in the only paper circulated here, as accurate as possible. I therefore take the liberty to write you on your article refuting the general tenor of your statements. The facts concerning "Gold Run" as far as the leaseholders are concerned, are these:

Their claims were staked at the recommendation of the Gold Commissioner, Mr. J. D. Graham, in the autumn of 1899 and granted by Order-in-Council on Nov. 14th, 1899 (as far as I recollect without referring). There were no miners on the ground at the time to put in any protest.

A privilege was granted to certain miners who came on the ground later on, presumably not knowing that they were paying record fees to the Government for ground which was already paying rent to them and an agreement made whereby these men should be allowed to stay and own the ground they had done actual mining on.

The common justice or equity of the then Gold Commissioner in recommending the granting of the leases, and, subsequently, after they were granted by Order-in-Council, in taking the record fees for the same ground from individual miners is in my modest opinion such a breach of contract as would render the Government liable to damages from either side of the case. I need say no more, as the agreement above mentioned, where-

PLACER v LEASEHOLD KING CONVALESCENT

The Miners Win the Day —
Their Rights

Are Recognized — Full List of
Those Whose Titles Have
Been Confirmed.

As the above title has gone on record, we make no apology for using it again, or for reversing the order of its significance. On the 30th ulto the order was issued by Gold Commissioner Graham that, in pursuance to an agreement entered into by Messrs. Wilson & Senkler, solicitors for certain leaseholders on Cold Run, with the Government, on behalf of the Gold Commissioner, that certain interests would be protected on the ground covered by said leaseholds, the following properties are entitled to full recognition:

The owners of the Natal group, 3 claims; the Delbert creek and Elsie bench claims; the Hermau and Christiana creek and bench; the Snowshoe group, 5 claims; the Winna claim; the Ethel, No. 7; the Pioneer group; the U O M and I O U; the Middlesex and Moonmouth benches; the Deadwood group; the Oro Blanco; the Oregon and Orient; the Agnes, Hope, Faith, Bessie and Kruger; claim No. 9; and the Willis group of 6 claims.

The agreement above referred to was made and entered into in Victoria on March 13th last year. The conclusion of the terms of agreement will doubtless set the minds of the several owners at rest, as the uncertainty of their tenure greatly interfered with the progress of development. We unhesitatingly congratulate the individual owners on the successful issue of this matter.

Parcel Postage Rates to the Yukon and Atlin from Canada Doubled.

The following is an extract from an Official order received at the Postoffice this week which came into effect on the 1st inst: "On all matter passing between the Atlin and Yukon districts, and any other part of the Dominion (except such as is paid for at the letter rate of two cents per ounce or fraction thereof, circulars, not exceeding two ounces in weight, and newspapers from the office of publication) the postal rates shall be DOUBLE those charged on the same classes of matter passing in any other part of the Dominion."

We will have something to say next week on this very extraordinary and unprecedented order of the Postmaster General.

Bulletins Will be Issued Once
a Day.

His Condition So Satisfactory that
Only One Physician Remains
In Attendance.

LONDON, July 4th.—Everything points to the satisfactory, though prolonged, convalescence of the King. It is expected that Bulletins regarding his condition will be reduced to one a day. Daily small crowds haunt the British Hospital Buckingham Palace. The physician remains in attendance at the Palace during the night.

Yesterday the following bulletin was posted: "His Majesty spent a comfortable night and he would now give comparatively little pain."

Piller is getting ready to sluice and has a good strip of pay opened out.

Bentley and Symons have completed the erection of a fine derrick, which will enable them to accomplish good work.

Shuttleworth and Dockrill have a strip of 400 feet cleaned off with excellent pay in sight.

The claims above mentioned are all below Discovery, and our Correspondent promises to keep us informed from time to time of the progress of work.

The Societe Miniere has repaired the damage wrought by the ice in freshet and are preparing to pay and gratifying prospect.
