## DREDGING.

Atlin's First Dredge Proves a Grand Success.

Ontlalitor, accompanied by Mr. D. Ross, nathager of the Bank o Commerce, paid a visit to the dredge-last Pheslay, where they verevery cordially received by the general manager, Mr. OTSwitzer, whonibdy slowed themover the dredge and explained its workings, which have already beel filly de seribed in previous isstes of this mper.

He dredge todas is in fulloperatonand hie line of buckets ponis abolvandine line of buckets ponts sliice, which is carried avay by an rerage of 2,000 inches of water, arsed for the purpose by a 6 and 10 inch phop.
, C ,
In the wash, at mintervals, enor. nous boulders are to be seen, many veighing over 10 , all of which ve easily passed throngh the ré olving, screen, and thoroughty wasbed by asteady stream of water. under pressure before being automatically dunped over the side of the dredge.
Owing to the fact that a face to bedrock must be opened up before lle dredge can move ahead, the ccom tated tailings have for the moment to be sbovelled away, which necessitates stopping the dredge for a while every halt hour; but this stoppage will not, however, be necessary as soun as bedrock is reached and the face dredged out. On Itusday the dredge was emoying tourteen men, to run two hifts, and on Thursday a third lift will be put on, making a total of twenty-one men, who will keep he dredge wotking steadily night aid day. As soon as the face (ivich is to be 150 feet wide and r arcular is fully opeued a circular ho up, the gang of nen now employed at shovellivg tailings will be laid oft and all the labor then required o run the monster machine for hree eight-hour shilts will beeight nen and a cook The electric over house employs six men and cook

Sir Henry M. Stanley, the African explorer, died last molith. He was originally Joht Rowlands, aud was born of obscure parents it Wales in 184 r . Whenasuall bor he worked his way to Nev Orlean as a cabin boy atid there adopted the name of a merchant for whom he worked for nany years He served in the Confederate arnuy and afterwards was in the United States navy. He becane a newspaper re porter aind later was war corres poident for the New jork Herald. Trwas while in the employec of the Herald that he foutd Livingstone and became faimons. He devoled many years to A frican explorations and wrote volimitionsly on that continent and bis ex feriences there He had mate his home in Eigland for twenty years and was a member of parliament. He was knighted in 1899.
