AMERICAN FIRM MAY BUILD BIG LUMBER MILL

It is reported that Wilson Bros., an American firm, who have large holdings of timber on the Nimpkish river on Vancouver Island and who have with the government regarding certain been recently conducting negotiations water rights will erect a plant which will cost from three to four million dollars.

This firm commenced negotiations as early as last February for privileges which would enable them to generate power for the operation of a big saw mill. Their proposition included the raising of the Nimpkish lake at least 96 feet and to dam the river. They figured on developing at least 30,000 horse power.

TO REQUEST GOVERNMENT TO BUILD BIG BRIDGE

VICTORIA—At this week's meeting of the council, the Johnson street bridge problem was again the main topic for discussion. The harbour committee a few days ago recommended that the E. & N. Ry. be asked to increase their contribution from \$80,000 to \$150,000, but after going over the matter thoroughly it was finally decided that the whole council wait upon the premier and request him, with the government to undertake the building of the bridge, also that the government bring into a joint agreement all the parties to be benefitted.

TYEE SMELTER WILL BE RE-OPENED SOON

VICTORIA—During his recent visit to Ladysmith, Hon. Lorne Campbell, minister of mines, visited the smelter and had a long conference with Mr. Watson, the manager of the Tyee Copper Company regarding the re-opening of the plant. Mr. Campbell, upon his return, stated that there is enough British Columbia ore now being shipped to the United States to keep the local smelter working constantly, and that he would give the matter his immediate attention. He firmly believes that the Tyee smelter will be opened before long.

Boyd, all of Vancouver, and A. W. McLeod, of New Westminster.

The Executive council of the Associated Boards of Trade of B. C. will meet today at 11 a.m. in the Board of Trade rooms.

Premier Bowser states that work on the Pacific Great Eastern Ry. will be resumed at once—probably next week.

The Great Northern Ry. has started a local service between Vancouver and Blaine for the benefit of the summer residents at Crescent, Ocean Park, and White Rock.

Work has been resumed in the dredging of False Creek. Two dredges are being operated by the Pacific Dredging Co.

According to local Canadian Northern railway officials, construction work on the new Canadian Northern Line from Kamloops to Kelowna will be started shortly. The line will be 140 miles long.

VICTORIA—A conference will take place today between representatives of the Board of Trade, the Victoria and Island Development Asso., Retail Merchants' Asso., and the Manufacturers' Asso. to consider the proposal to amalgamate.

SAANICH—The assessment roll of Saanich has been submitted to the council and shows a reduction of 9.97 per cent. on the land assessment of 1915.

ESQUIMALT—Applications for the position of sewer inspector will be received up to 4 p.m. Monday, June 19th by G. H. Pullen, C.M.C.

SOUTH VANCOUVER—The municipal council has appointed Clerk J. B. Springford municipal license inspector.

SOUTH VANCOUVER—The school board has let fire insurance on their buildings and equipment for \$166,000.

NORTH VANCOUVER—Fire Chief Findlay has reported to the council that during the past month there were only two alarms of fire. The value of the property and contents in danger were \$14,800. The total loss was \$240.45.

SURREY—The Surrey council has gone on record as opposed to the proposed highway along the international boundary, of which the Langley and Matsqui and Sumas councils are strong advocates.

MINING

SPOKANE, Wash., California capitalists have taken a bond on a group of claims on Bayonne mountain in the Sheep Creek district, south of Nelson, B. C. agreeing to pay \$140,000 for 22 claims.

The claims include five groups, all of which are said to have rich showings in free-milling gold. Several Nelson persons are included in the list of owners, Alexander Stewart and William Maher holding the largest interests.

PROVINCIAL ESTIMATES ARE TABLED IN THE HOUSE

VICTORIA—A revenue of just under \$6,000,000 and an expenditure of \$11,000,000 for the year commencing April 1 next is predicted in the provincial estimates which were tabled in the House by Hon. Lorne Campbell, Minister of Finance, on Monday.

The summary of estimated expenditures indicates that in four of the 14 Government services there will probably be an increased expenditure over last year. In the rest a reduction is predicted.

In this year's report of the estimates the service "miscellaneous" is divided into three categories: "Land" upon which \$665,000 is to be spent this year, and "agriculture," upon which \$176,500 will probably be expended, are each given a service to themselves, thus greatly reducing the "miscellaneous" total.

Present conditions have also necessitated more and larger hospitals, the result being an unusually large increase for hospitals and charities. Last year \$16,000 was voted in the way of assistance in the construction of hospitals. This year about \$160,000 will probably be granted for that purpose. Grants to various hospitals, etc., is increased from \$19,000 to \$30,000.

University of B. C. Among the appropriations in this year's estimates is a conditional one of \$200,000 for the University of British Columbia. Last year's estimate was \$176,000. Included in the works and buildings to be constructed by the Public Works Department are the following: Okalla prison farm, \$15,000; improvement of government reserve, Burnaby \$10,000; mental hospital and colony farm, Esquimalt, \$35,000; provincial government buildings, London (completion and maintenance), \$175,000; provincial normal school, Vancouver, maintenance, \$3,000. The appropriations for roads, streets, bridges and wharves in each constituency are the same as last year. Chilliwack gets \$33,300; Delta, \$24,000; Dewdney, \$65,500; and Richmond \$40,000. Eighty thousand is devoted for Kingsway through the Municipality of Burnaby. Point Grey gets \$10,000 for roads, and Nicomen Island the same amount for dyking; \$13,500 is a subsidy for the Ladner-Woodward ferry.

The vote of \$400,000 on last year's estimates for the Second Narrows bridge is left off for bridges generally \$450,000 is set down while the bridge over the Fraser River at Prince George there will be an appropriation of \$150,000.

An item in the Land Department appropriations is that for \$20,000 for timber testing and investigation of wood products. An indication that the government intends to continue seeking overseas markets for the B. C. lumber trade is that another \$60,000 is appropriated for salaries, travelling expenses, and purchase of material.

Other Appropriations. Among the other appropriations are the following: Grant to B. C. regiments \$5,000, grant to patriotic fund \$6,000, grant to boy scouts \$1,000, grant to Victorian Order of Nurses \$500, grant to returned soldiers' aid committee \$15,000, Royal Commissions \$15,000, last year \$50,000, cougar bounty \$35,000. Contribution to Vancouver toward purchase of certain lanes in Ward VIII, \$5,000, Fraser River Bridge. New appropriations for maintenance and repairs, \$20,200. Songhees Reserve Improvements, \$240,000.

TO RENOVATE CHURCH.

VICTORIA—The First Baptist Church building, Yates and Quadras, will be painted and renovated in the near future.

VICTORIA—Many fires are reported from the Port George Forest District, both on non-timbered and timbered lands, the efforts of the forest officers being mainly directed to saving the latter. Three million feet of timber have been destroyed at Willow River; other damage including the destruction of thirteen cabins at Alza Lake and eight buildings at Chief Lake.

LANGLEY—Councillor Williams has sold the plant of the Sperling Lumber Co. to Mr. Wm. Macdonald, who will locate it on the Pacific Highway and Livingstone road, while Councillor Williams will operate another mill on the Salmon River near Jardine.

VICTORIA—The city comptroller's statement for May shows credit balances of \$1,719,533, and debit balances of \$649,370. The sewer loan is now standing at \$62,000, with about \$20,000 worth of work in hand.
