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### BUILDING NEWS

And Construction Work not otherwise Classified.

**VANCOUVER**—The Washington Machinery & Equipment Co., Smith Bldg., Seattle, are in the market for a large amount of contractors' equipment anywhere up to \$200,000 worth.

**VANCOUVER**—Mr. Haddon, secretary Vancouver General Hospital, stated Saturday afternoon that no definite arrangements as to building the military hospital would be made until after the middle of this week.

**VANCOUVER**—It is expected that the Pacific Mills Limited, will be ready to start manufacturing paper around April 1 next. The buildings at Ocean Falls are nearly ready and large consignments of machinery are now arriving.

**ESQUIMALT**—Tenders are requested for the repair and alterations of road in Naval Canteen Ground, Esquimalt. Replies should be addressed to the Paymaster, H.M.C. Dockyard, Esquimalt, who will furnish full particulars of work required.

**VANCOUVER**—Tenders have been submitted by local contractors for the construction of a reinforced concrete wagon shed to be erected for the Imperial Oil Co., Ltd., at the yards on Smythe Street. The contract will be let in the near future.

**PENTICTON**—Dominion Cannery who have been operating a cannery at Vernon for the past three years, will build and operate a cannery in Penticton this year, if a sufficient tonnage can be secured. Their British Columbia business is now in charge of Mr. P. M. Groom.

**VANCOUVER**—To consider trade conditions generally and discuss matters pertaining to their several crafts, the affiliated unions constituting the Building Trade Council have arranged to hold a mass meeting on Saturday evening, February 3, at the Labor Temple.

**VANCOUVER**—A large volume of lumber will be shipped east during next spring in the opinion of local freight men. A large number of orders have been sent in from the prairie provinces where there will be considerable building done during the summer. Local mills are now busy getting the lumber ready.

**VANCOUVER**—Mundy, Rowland & Co., Standard Bank Bldg., have the contract for all electrical work in connection with the construction of twelve auxiliary schooners for the Canada West Coast Navigation Co. Six of these schooners are to be built at Wallace Shipyards, No. 2, North Vancouver, and the rest at the Cameron-Genoa plant at Esquimalt.

**VICTORIA**—Eastern capital will be available for development purposes for the Dolly Varlen and Wolf mining groups on the Kitsault river, according to R. B. McGinnis of San Francisco, manager of the controlling syndicate, who arrived here from the south. A mill and power plant and added transportation facilities will be installed as well as wharfage at tidewater. By summer 200 men will be employed. Mr. McGinnis predicts much development work in the Alice Arm area.

**SOUTH VANCOUVER**—The council has accepted the resignation of Engineer Bennett to date from the end of February.

**NORTH VANCOUVER**—The first auxiliary schooner built in North Vancouver was launched at the Wallace Shipbuilding Company's number two yard Saturday afternoon.

**VANCOUVER**—A fire at the premises occupied by the Johnson Salsbury Hardware Co., at 130 Hastings Street West, last week caused a small amount of damage.

**LADNER**—The Delta Telephone Co., Ltd., held their annual meeting last week when directors were appointed as follows: Dr. I. Ker Wilson, A. D. Paterson, C. Brown, J. B. Burr, A. de R. Taylor.

**NEW WESTMINSTER**—The New Westminster Board of Trade has endorsed a resolution asking the Provincial Government to proceed with the completion of the Hope-Princeton link of the transprovincial highway.

**VICTORIA**—Payment of \$74,145 to the Pacific Great Eastern Railway Co. for construction work carried on in November as certified to by the government's engineers, was authorized by the executive council last week. Two payments of \$5,714 and \$1,340 to the Burrard peninsula sewerage board were also approved.

**VICTORIA**—Andrew Larson, one of the best known mining engineers in the northwest, is here from his Spokane headquarters in connection with development of copper mining on Vancouver island. Harry Treat, of Seattle, who is a well-known mining man, is also a Victoria visitor in connection with the development of the mineral resources of this section.

**VICTORIA**—The following company incorporations are announced: International Chemical Company, Ltd., of Victoria, capital of \$20,000; The Lone Star Mining and Milling Company, Ltd., capital of \$1,000,000 and head office in Vancouver; B. C. Shipyards, Ltd., of Vancouver, capital \$100,000; The Deeks Gravel and Rock Company, of Vancouver, capital \$10,000; Deep C. Fisheries, Ltd., Prince Rupert, capital, \$50,000; Branch Ranch Mines, Ltd., of Kamloops, capital \$100,000; The World Film Company, Ltd., of Vancouver, capital \$15,000; Smith Bros. & Company, Limited, wholesale and retail grocers of North Vancouver, capital, \$10,000.

**VANCOUVER**—The Imperial Bank of Canada has acquired by purchase from Robertson & Co., of Victoria, the northeast corner of Hastings and Homer streets. A slight decline is noticeable in the price paid for the property, \$130,000, which works out at \$2000 a foot frontage, the lowest sum within recent years for building land on Hastings Street being the site on which the Union Bank now stands, for which \$3000 a foot was given. According to a statement made by the manager of the bank, Mr. Lay, the intention of the company is eventually to erect its own premises thereon. The present tenant, Mr. G. S. Forsyth, holds a lease that has still 15 months to run, terminating in May, 1918.

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MINING

PROVINCIAL ESTIMATES ARE TABLED IN THE HOUSE. VICTORIA. A revenue of just under \$6,000,000 and an expenditure of \$11,000,000 for the year commencing April 1 next is predicted in the provincial estimates which were tabled in the House by Hon. George Campbell, Minister of Finance, on Monday.

Summary of Expenditure. The summary of estimated expenditure indicates that four of the 14 Government services will probably be an increased expenditure over last year. In the rest a reduction is predicted.

Present conditions have also necessitated an increase in the expenditure for hospitals and charities. Last year \$16,000 was voted in the way of assistance for the hospital at London.

Among the appropriations in this year's estimates is a conditional one of \$200,000 for the University of British Columbia.

Other Appropriations. Among the other appropriations are: Grant to B. C. regiments \$5,000, grant to boy scouts \$1,000, grant to Victorian Order of Nurses \$500, grant to returned soldiers' aid commissions \$15,000.

OTTAWA—The main estimates for the fiscal year commencing last April provide for a total expenditure of \$188,931,218. The total estimates for the current fiscal year, which closes on March 31, were for \$196,853,517. There is, therefore, a decrease of nearly \$8,000,000, apart of course, from any supplementary estimates which may be brought down before the end of the session. It is not expected, however, that these will be large.

The reduction in the estimates is all the more noticeable because, there is an increase of \$16,001,253 for public debt charges including interest and sinking fund and an increase of \$915,122 for pensions.

There are no new items for public works and undertakings, except for necessary repairs, and it is expected that the policy announced at the outbreak of the war will be continued and that only work under contract or indispensably necessary in the public interest will be proceeded with.

Hudson's Bay Railway. There is a vote of \$3,000,000 for the construction of the Hudson's Bay Railway terminals and elevators. It is evidently the intention not to push forward this work as vigorously as last year, as there was a vote then of

\$5,500,000. For the National Transcontinental Railway there is a vote of \$1,500,000. For Quebec bridge, which is still under construction and will not be completed until 1917, there is a vote of \$3,450,000.

The vote for St. John harbor improvements is cut down from \$1,500,000 to \$1,000,000, and for harbor and river improvements at Fort William and Port Arthur from \$1,700,000 to \$1,000,000. Other large votes are: Halifax drydock, \$250,000; Quebec harbor improvements, \$400,000; Quebec drydock, \$1,500,000; improvements to navigation in Quebec harbor, \$700,000; Toronto harbor improvements, \$600,000; French River waterways improvements, \$400,000; Vancouver harbor improvements, \$350,000; Victoria harbor improvements, \$1,000,000, and Esquimalt drydock, \$200,000.
