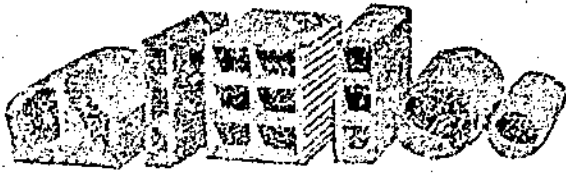

VICTORIA BUILDING PERMITS
Arrangements have been made by the British Columbia Record to publish the building permits issued in Victoria once a week.

BRICK BUILDING FOR PENDER STREET EAST
Architect W. T. Whiteway, 1412 Dominion building, will award a contract in a few days for the construction of a one-story and basement hollow-tile and brick building, 25x50 feet, to be erected on Pender street east, between Main street and Gore avenue. The building is for Mr. Olaf Olson and will cost in the neighborhood of \$7,000.

TO BUILD ATTRACTIVE HOME IN POINT GREY
A very attractive 3-room bungalow is to be erected on 19th avenue W., Point Grey, for Mr. Fred J. Tacey of J. R. Tacey & Son.
Plans for the new home were prepared by architect W. T. Whiteway, Dominion building, and Mr. P. Tardif, 1121 Bidwell street will construct the building which is to cost \$3,500.

The building will be 41x24 feet with a full concrete basement, while built in book cases, fire place, panelled and beamed ceilings and oak floors are among the features of the living rooms. A cosy built in breakfast nook, cabinet, cooling closet, etc. make a very pleasing arranged kitchen.

WANT NEW SCHOOL BUILT CLOVERDALE—Residents in the district near Kennedy station have applied to the Surrey School board for the immediate erection of a new school in that district. Their nearest school is the Strawberry Hill one, which is reported to be sadly overcrowded.

\$10,000 FOR NEW BRIDGE
Following strong representations made by the West Vancouver municipal council, the provincial government has voted \$10,000 towards the rebuilding of the Marine Drive bridge over the Capilano river. It is expected that the balance of the \$20,000 required will be provided jointly by the Dominion government and the municipalities of North and West Vancouver.

CANADIAN MOTORISTS SEEKS FACTORY SITE NEW WESTMINSTER—Seeking a suitable site for the erection of a new factory, which it is planned to erect either in New Westminster or Vancouver, a deputation representing the Canadian Motorists, Ltd., interviewed the city council last night. The company proposes to erect a factory for the assembling and rebuilding of motor trucks and automobile parts and accessories, if they can secure a site that will be suitable.
The council offered the company the triangular piece of land on Twelfth avenue, near Columbia street, under a lease to run 20 years. The rent proposed was \$500 per year for the first five years, \$750 per year for the second five years, and \$1000 per year for the last ten years. The representatives of the company seemed favorably impressed with the offer and stated they would consider it.

TO AVOID DOUBLE TAXATION
The International Coal & Coke Co., Ltd., which operates collieries at Coleman, Alberta, is preparing to transfer its charter from the state of Washington to the Dominion of Canada in order to avoid double taxation. In addition to the Canadian taxes, the company has been for some time past paying taxes in the United States, which amounted to between \$1,200 and \$1,500 per month, and this was considered too heavy a drain to keep up. It is reported that there are a number of well known mining companies operating in the northern as well as interior portion of British Columbia which will adopt similar action in the near future.

PROPOSES TO SPEND \$3,500,000 IN PUBLIC WORKS IN PROVINCE
VICTORIA.—Indicative of the government's intention to carry out a fairly ambitious programme of public works this year in order to give employment to as many returned soldiers as possible, is the bill which was introduced in the legislature on Monday by Hon. John Hart, minister of finance. The bill provides for the bor-

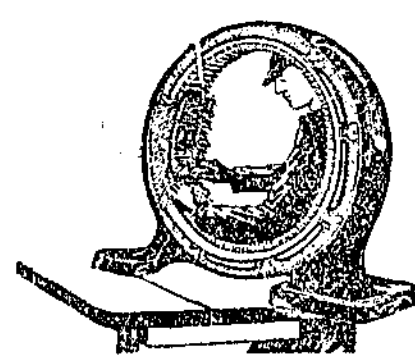

SOLDIERS AND REFORESTATION

The employment of returned soldiers in reforestation work in Canada is the subject upon which a delegation representing the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association will confer with the Dominion Government at Ottawa in a few days. In Great Britain and France the replacement of forests destroyed by the necessities of war is proceeding rapidly. The delegation will urge that the example of European countries be followed in Canada, which possesses many thousands of acres of barren lands that are suitable for reforestation, even when they would not produce results as agricultural lands.

The reforestation task, according to the delegation, should be undertaken by the Dominion, as a considerable

period of time elapses before returns are assured. A substantial addition to the national wealth should be the ultimate result. The delegation will urge that returned men who have become accustomed to outdoor life, or who need such work on account of disabilities, should receive special consideration in such employment.

Brigadier-General J. B. White, who commanded a forestry unit in France, will probably head the delegation, which will assemble in Ottawa this week. Sir William Price, who went overseas with a Quebec battalion, and Gerald Power, president of the Dominion Lumberman's Association, will be among the delegates. It is probable that a couple of western lumbermen will also represent this part of the Dominion, as invitations have been sent to a number of western men to join the delegation.

MINING

MEN NEEDED AT ANYOX

Twelve hundred men are needed immediately to reopen the Granby mining and smelting plant at Anyox, which has been closed since March 2, following a fire there. This statement was made yesterday afternoon by O. B. Smith, mines superintendent.

Nearly every class of mechanic and artisan is included in the list of positions that are open. Returned soldiers, it is said, will be given preference in such cases where they are qualified to fill any vacancy.

The new staff to enable the plant to resume operations will be hired at company's offices here, 813 Birk's building.

Coeur d'Alene (Idaho) lead miners have accepted a reduction of \$1 per day in wage scale, being still 50 cents above the sliding scale adopted some time ago.

BRADSTREET'S WEEKLY REPORT

Trade is only fair in Canada, country merchants being well stocked and hesitating to buy, fearing lower prices, which, however, are rather scouted by wholesalers, who point to all costs being high. The strike at New York has slowed down the export cattle trade at Toronto, but while cattle are easier, hogs are higher. Building has not yet begun on any large scale. Montreal reports that navigation will open early. Eggs and potatoes are lower, but hay is very firm. Speculation is active on the exchanges. Winnipeg reports trade and collections good, manufacturing active, and weather very cold. Bank clearings for the week total \$194,547,000, as against \$201,747,000 last week and \$168,537,000 in this week a year ago. Failures for the week number 10, as against 13 last week and 23 in this week a year ago.

John Bright, of Trail, is completing a bungalow on Smelter hill, near the new concentrator, and plans are being prepared for several other residences this spring.

Ten miles of the main channel will be constructed this season on the government irrigation project in the Osoyoos district on the land recently purchased from the Southern Okanagan Land Company.

The Kelowna Board of Trade are making an effort to have a road built between McCulloch and Carmi, a distance of 26 miles. This road would link the North Thompson, Okanagan, Boundary and Kootenay districts together.

While it is not possible to say yet whether any construction work will start on a branch transmission line from the West Kootenay cross country line northwards to reach Penticton this year, the heads of the company have by no means given up the idea of getting to Penticton in the near future, it is said.
