VICTORIA—When the city council in more optimistic times than the present contemplated a new city hall and submitted a referendum to the citizens on the site of a new building, one of the schemes contemplated the expropriation of the Leeming Brothers' Ltd., property at the rear of the hall and also the Pottery building. The land has continued vacant, having been loaned by the owners for a Salvation Army wood depot, and then for a market, and is now offered to the city for \$50,000. A letter to that effect is now on file at the City Hall, to be considered by the City Council on Monday. The owners offer to take city or Dominion Government bonds for the property.

PROVINCIAL ESTIMATES ARE TABLED IN THE HOUSE

VICTORIA—A revenue of just under \$6,000,000 and an expenditure of \$11,000,000 for the year commencing April 1 next is predicted in the provincial estimates which were tabled in the House by Hon. Lorne Campbell, Minister of Finance, on Monday.

The exact estimated revenue is \$5,944,015, as compared with \$7,184,815 for the present year. The increase is more than accounted for by the increased fixed charges which are over \$300,000.

The summary of estimated expenditure indicates that in four of the 14 Government services there will probably be an increased expenditure over the year. In the rest a reduction is predicted.

In this year's report of the estimates the service "miscellaneous" is divided into three distinct services. "Lands" upon which \$55,000 is to be spent this year and "agriculture" upon which \$174,500 will probably be expended, are each given a service to themselves, greatly reducing the "miscellaneous" total.

Present conditions have also necessitated more and larger hospitals. The result being a substantial increase for hospitals and charities. Last year \$14,000 was voted in the way of assistance in the construction of hospitals. This year about \$450,000 will probably be granted for that purpose. Grants to refuge homes, aid societies, etc., is increased from \$19,000 to \$38,000.

Among the appropriations in this year's estimates is a conditional one of \$200,000 for the University of British Columbia. Included in the works and buildings to be constructed by the Public Works Department are the following: Okalla prison, \$115,000; improvement of government reserve, Burnaby, \$10,000; mental hospital and colony farm, Esquimalt, \$35,000; provincial government buildings, London (completion and maintenance), \$175,000; maintenance, \$8,000. The appropriations provincial normal school, Vancouver, for roads, streets, bridges and wharves in each constituency are the same as last year. Chilliwack gets \$33,300; Delta, \$22,500; Dewdney, \$65,500; and Richmond, \$40,000. Eight thousand is devoted for Kingsway through the Municipality of Burnaby. Point Grey gets \$10,000 for roads, and Nicomen Island the same amount for dyking. \$13,500 is a subsidy for operation of Woodward ferry.

Other Appropriations
The vote of \$400,000 on last year's estimates for the Second Narrows bridge is left off. For bridges generally \$450,000 is set down, while for the bridge over the Fraser River at Prince George there will be an appropriation of \$150,000.

An item in the Land Department appropriations is that for \$20,000 for wood testing and investigation of timber products. An indication that the government intends to continue seeking overseas markets for the B. C. lumber trade is that another \$50,000 is appropriated for salaries, travelling expenses, and purchase of material.

Among the other appropriations are the following: B. C. regiments \$5,000, grant to patriotic fund \$6,000, grant to boy scouts \$1,000, grant to Victorian Order of Nurses \$500, grant to returned soldiers' aid commission \$15,000, Royal Commissioners \$15,000 (last year \$50,000), cougar bounty \$35,000. Contribution to Vancouver toward purchase of certain lines in Ward VIII, \$5,000. Fraser River Bridge, New Westminster, maintenance and repairs, \$20,200. Songhees Reserve improvements, \$240,000.

W. B. Dornberg, of Revelstoke, one of the officials of the Lanark mine, at Illecillaquet, near Revelstoke, spent a few days in the city this week, on smelter business. The mine sent 224 tons of ore to the Consolidated smelter this year.

The Bosum mine, New Denver, which has been closed down for a number of years has been taken over by the Surprise Mining Co., and is now being operated by them, they have considerable milling ore in sight and expect to be shipping shortly.

The Golden Wender group, owned by W. S. Harris and Denis Comeau, of Hazelton, has been bonded to M. W. Sutherland, who has been conducting development work upon it. The group is situated at the foot of the west slope of Rocher Deboulle mountain on the Hazelton wagon road.

A great many mine men in this section of the country feel confident that a smelter located in or near Kamloops with a spur from both the C.P.R. and Canadian Northern would mean that many mining properties now untouched might be developed.

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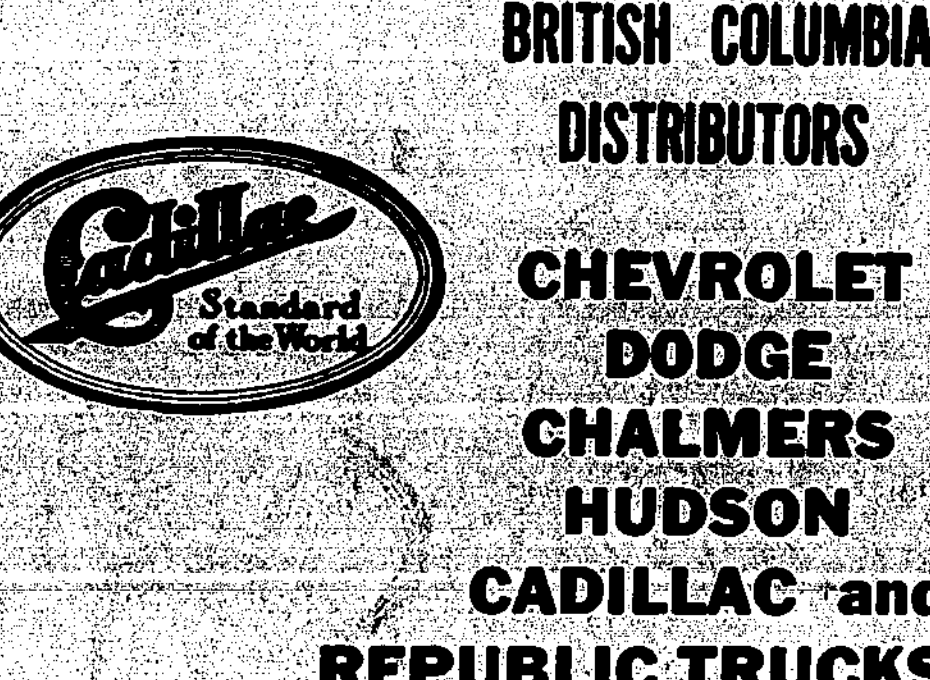
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
