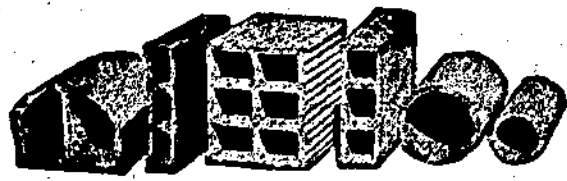

PREDICT ADVANCE IN

TRANSPACIFIC RATES

Transpacific freight rates are due for a boost, according to traffic men engaged in Asiatic trade out of Seattle. The present lack of tonnage and rush

to get certain materials across, especially shipbuilding supplies, are responsible, it is said. These rates, it is predicted, will climb until tonnage is increased to Vladivostok and other Asiatic points by direct lines. The rate on general commodities is now around \$40 to \$45 per ton to Japan and a little more to China. It may advance to \$60. Steel and shipbuilding material are bringing a higher rate than general goods. There is no business in the flour trade now, exporters say, in the Japanese or Chinese market. It is said

than an inquiry on flour rates was made recently, with the result that flour was quoted at \$40 per ton. With the prevailing prices of flour here and the freight tacked on, the price of the cereal was out of reach of the Asiatic consumer.

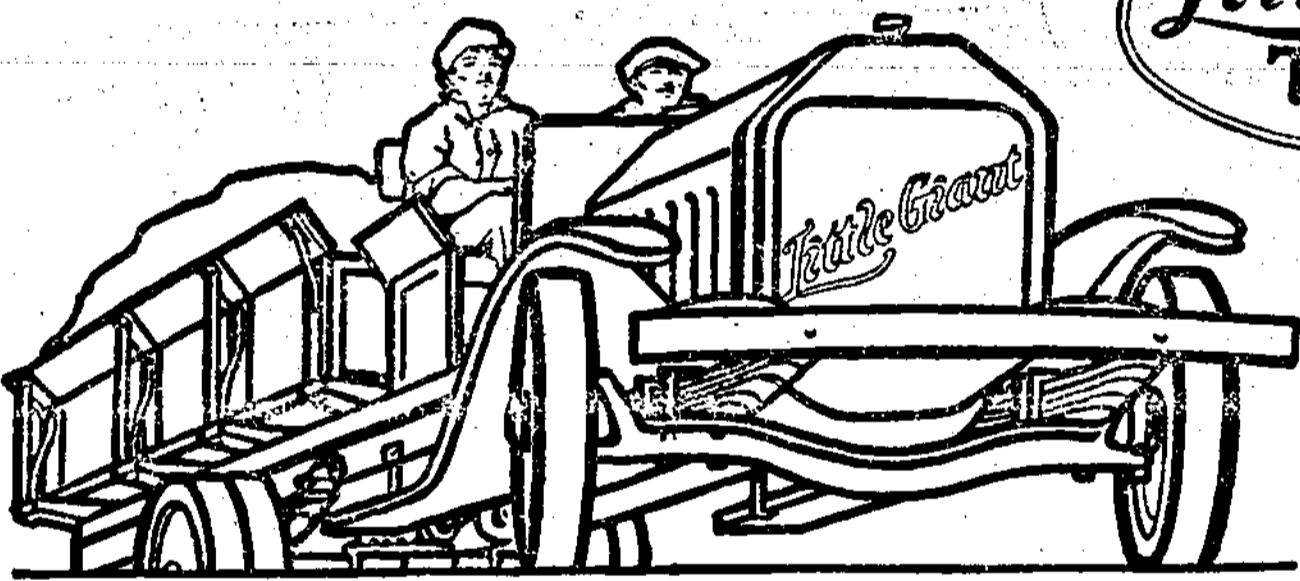
