BUILDING NEWS

And Construction Work not otherwise
Classified.

PENTICTON—A bylaw for \$15,000 to
erect a reservoir will be brought before
the public in January.

CLOVERDALE—Tenders will be re-
ceived by C. Lemax, C.M.C., up to 6
p.m., November 2, for the installation
of hot water heating apparatus in the
Municipal building, Cloverdale.

PORT MOODY—The B. C. Telephone
Company is calling for tenders for
clearing a lot on Clarke Street upon
which they intend erecting their local
exchange.

PENTICTON—The council has autho-
rized the purchase of 12 five-ampere
wait hour meters and two ten-ampere
wait hour meters. The purchase of a
new Diesel engine at a cost of about
\$25,000 is also contemplated.

VANCOUVER—An up-to-date child-
ren's hospital in connection with the
General Hospital for the treatment of
children is recommended by Dr. M. T.
MacEachern, superintendent of the
General Hospital.

VANCOUVER—That the new provin-
cial government should as soon as pos-
sible complete the Hope-Princeton
road, thus linking up and making pos-
sible an all-Canada highway, was the
effect of a resolution adopted after con-
siderable discussion last week by the
transportation committee of the board
of trade. It was in the form of a re-
commendation to the full board and
without question will be endorsed by
that body when it comes before it.

VANCOUVER—The proposal to
erect a bath-house at English Bay, was
the most important matter which was
considered by the Parks Board at its
meeting last week. No further step was
taken towards presenting the board's
views to the City Council with the ob-
ject of having a by-law providing the
money for the scheme submitted to the
electors at the municipal elections in
January next.

Statistics bearing on the approxi-
mate cost of the proposal were sub-
mitted by the board's engineer, Mr.
A. S. Wootton, as follows: Estimated
cost of structure complete, including
manager's residence, heating, light-
ing, ventilation, water supply, boilers,
pumps, sea protection and contingen-
cies, \$68,000; inspection, \$1,000; land-
dry machinery, \$2,000; stock, \$2,500;
furnishing, \$1,500; total \$75,000.

NORTH VANCOUVER—Correspon-
dence is passing between the district
council and the harbor board with a
view to setting a date on which the
two bodies can meet to discuss the
proposed harbor development scheme.

NEW WESTMINSTER—In the en-
deavor to foster the industrial develop-
ment of the city, a committee consist-
ing of members of the city council and
Board of Trade is fathering a scheme
the object of which is to induce the C.
N. R. to lease its waterfront property
in this city as industrial sites, the idea
being that if the company can escape
taxation by building shunting tracks,
which would be of no benefit to the
city, it might secure the same object
by locating industries. The idea has
crystallized in the form of a resolu-
tion which will be debated at the next
meeting of the Board of Trade.

BUSINESS NOTES

EDMONDS—The residence of Mr.
James McIsaac, of Royal Oak Avenue,
Burnaby, has been destroyed by fire.

PENTICTON—The Waterman resi-
dence has been totally destroyed by
fire. Loss, \$35,000.

VICTORIA—Announcement is made
of the addition to the list of members
of the B. C. Land Surveyors of the
names of Francis B. Monteith, Yanco-
ver, and C. M. Hoar, of Calgary.

KERRISDALE—The McDonald St.
sewer question is to be threshed out
at a conference to be held between the
municipal council and the Vancouver
and District Sewerage Board on Thurs-
day, November 2. Two reports on the
sewer have been made, one favoring
the sewer and the other by Engineer
Creer, condemning it. Under the act
the Sewerage Board is bound to take
it over from the municipality.

SOUTH VANCOUVER—Last week
the municipal council was busy clearing
away objections from the path of a big
iron industry which is seeking a loca-
tion in the municipality, and although
negotiations are still going on members
have declared themselves hopeful that
they will be successful in their en-
deavors. The concern is a rolling mill,
which would employ probably 100 men,
and would agree to turn out 30 tons of
iron per day.

VICTORIA—Incorporated with a
capital of three million dollars the Pa-
cific International Copper Company,
Limited (Non-Personal Liability), has
been granted a charter as a mining and
refining company with power to mine
for and treat copper and all other ores.
The head office of the company will
be in Vancouver.

The Alice Arm Mining and Develop-
ment Company, Limited, will have its
headquarters at Alice Arm, and has an
authorized capital of \$500,000. It will
not only carry on mining, but has
power to acquire water rights, develop
power, generate and sell electric light
and power, build telegraph lines, smel-
ters, refineries, sawmills and numerous
other industries.

The Kutze Development Company,
Limited, is also chartered with a capi-
tal of \$10,000 and head offices in Van-
couver, to carry on mining and devel-
opment work. Other incorporations are
those of Canadian Beet Sugar Com-
pany, Limited, capital \$10,000, Van-
couver; Chambers Packing Company,
Limited, Vancouver \$25,000; Fraser
River Shingle Company, Limited, Van-
couver, \$10,000; Winram Motor Com-
pany Limited, Vancouver, \$20,000.

The Victoria Truck and Dray Com-
pany, Limited has amended its mem-
orandum of association, with the con-
sent of the court and the approval of
the registrar of joint stock companies.
L. C. Smith & Bros. Typewriter Co.
has ceased to transact business in this
province.

The partnership hitherto existing
between Andrew Wright and James B.
Manton, carrying on business at
Lansdowne road as florists, gardeners
and landscape gardeners, under the
style of Wright & Manton or Lans-
downe Floral Company, has been dis-
solved from Sept. 1. The business is
being continued by James B. Manton
as the Lansdowne Floral Company.

VANCOUVER—A writ has been issued by the Royal Bank of Canada, claiming from Mr. Price Ellison former minister of agriculture, the sum of \$15,000 as a guarantor of the account of the Dominion Stock and Bond Corporation.

PROVINCIAL ESTIMATES ARE PASSED IN THE HOUSE. VICTORIA, B.C., Revenue of just under \$6,000,000 and an expenditure of \$1,000,000 for the year commencing April 1 next is predicted in the provincial estimates which were tabled in the House of Commons by the Minister of Finance on Monday.

Summary of Expenditure. The summary of estimated expenditure indicates that, in four of the Government services there will probably be an increased expenditure over last year. In the rest a reduction is predicted.

University of B. C. Among the appropriations in this year's estimates is a conditional one of \$200,000 for the University of British Columbia.

Other Appropriations. Among the other appropriations are the following: Grant to B. C. regiments \$5,000, grant to patriotic fund \$6,000, grant to boy scouts \$1,000, grant to Victoria Order of Nurses \$500, grant to returned soldiers \$15,000, grant to Royal Commission \$15,000 (last year \$50,000), cougar bounty \$35,000, contribution to Vancouver toward purchase of Fraser River Bridge, New Westminster, maintenance and repairs, \$20,200, Songhees Reserve improvements, \$240,000.

VICTORIA—The Victoria bank clearings for the week ending Oct. 26, totalled \$1,763,965.

VICTORIA—By a recent order-in-council of the Dominion government a new scale of fees has been established for the verification of gas meters and for the calorific and purity tests required by the Gas Inspection act.

SOUTH VANCOUVER—Fire Chief Lester of South Vancouver in a report on the operations of the fire department for the quarter ended Sept. 30, states that the number of alarms was 22. The total value of the property involved was \$22,810, total insurance \$11,600, total loss, \$2,150, as follows: On buildings, \$1,345; on contents, \$1,395; amount of insurance above property loss \$845.

PORTLAND, Ore.—With election of officers the Pacific Coast Logging congress terminated its sessions here Friday. The officers chosen are: President, W. W. Peed, Eureka, Cal.; vice-president, T. J. Humbird, Sand Point, Idaho; secretary-treasurer, George M. Cornwall, Portland. Members of the executive committee were named as follows: British Columbia, J. M. Dempsey, Vancouver; B. C., Donald McDonald, Scotia, Idaho; H. M. Stathern, Port Falls, Montana; W. R. Ballard, Somers, Ore.; A. H. Powers, Marshfield, Wash.; George A. Johnson, Seattle. Among resolutions adopted by the congress was one recommending that the workmen's compensation act be extended to all districts in which logging operations are conducted on the Pacific Coast, and another favoring provision for educational facilities for workmen in all logging camps to teach simple physics, sanitation, and the elementary branches of forestry.

PORTLAND—National and international co-operation as means of developing the lumber industry were earnestly urged from a variety of sources at the Forest and Conservation Congress last week. The international aspect of the lumber trade was presented by H. R. MacMillan, timber trade commissioner for the Canadian Government, who has just returned from a trip around the world, where he investigated the possible future lumber markets. While Mr. MacMillan spoke largely from the standpoint of a Canadian producer, he declared that the problems of the British Columbia, lumber industry and of the Oregon and Washington lumber industry are analogous. He declared that the future salvation of the whole lumber business of the Northwest is the export trade, and in that particular British Columbia and the North Pacific States should work together. Other speakers were W. B. Greeley of the Federal Forestry Service, and Dr. Frank R. Rutter of the Federal Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce.
