COWLEY—The Doukhobors have commenced the erection of a 70,000 bushel grain elevator here.

TRAIL—A petition is now being circulated asking the city council to start construction of a sewerage system here as soon as possible.

GREENWOOD—At an expense of about \$1,000 the fourth room in the Public School building is being fitted up for a High School.

TRAIL—The Methodists of Trail have decided to build a new parsonage to be erected on the site of the present structure. It will be a two-story frame structure.

The contract for the construction of the drainage ditch at Port Mann for the Canadian Northern Pacific Ry. has been let to Gus Nelson Co., Vancouver. Work will be started immediately.

VANCOUVER—Tenders for the repairs to the roof of the Museum were rejected at Monday night's council meeting as too high. New bids are now asked for and specifications can be had at the Building Inspector's office, City Hall.

VANCOUVER—Up to a late hour yesterday afternoon no word had been received in this city regarding the awards made for subcontracts in connection with the construction of the new Pantages Theater, this city. It is thought, however, that announcements will be made this week.

VANCOUVER—The Canadian Northern Pacific Ry. will receive tenders addressed to M. H. MacLeod at Union Station, Winnipeg, up to 6 p.m., October 2nd, for the construction of freight offices and freight sheds at False Creek, Vancouver. Plans and specifications may be seen at the office of the architect, 819 Vancouver Bldg., Vancouver, on and after Sept. 15th.

VANCOUVER—Several sketch plans have been submitted to Newton J. Ker, Townsite Agent, Canadian Pacific Ry. for a building to replace the Club House of the Shaughnessy Heights Golf Club, which was recently destroyed by fire. At the present time these plans are being gone over by the C. P. officials and it is announced that no decision will be arrived at for the next two or three days.

VANCOUVER—Mr. Fee, of Fee & Stevens, who prepared the plans for the alterations to the MacKechnie Block, 532 Granville St., has let the contract for the general alterations to Walter Hepburn, 615 Pender St. W., who has already commenced operations. This contract does not include the plumbing, heating or electric work for which Mr. Fee is now taking tenders. These contracts will be awarded within a week. The total cost of the work will amount to about \$10,000.

BUSINESS NOTES
and other items of interest to the business man.

VANCOUVER—Lord Shaughnessy and party are scheduled to arrive on the coast next Saturday.

VICTORIA—Rather than spend money on dredging the mud around the city wharf at Garbally road, the streets committee has decided to apply for government action.

TRAIL—The city clerk has been instructed to write to Vernon to secure data on cost of lighting that place. The present street lighting of Trail being deemed totally inadequate.

PENTICTON—The K. V. R. has 12 engines at Penticton and will soon have 30. In a few months there will be 300 railway men in that town, and many more houses will have to be built to house them and their families.

RICHMOND—Damage amounting to approximately \$40,000 was done to the recently started steel factory in the old Dominion Safe Works on Lulu Island by fire which broke out on Sunday morning. The industry represented an investment of \$110,000 and the chief shareholder was Thomas Watt of Seventy-first and Osler Ave.

VICTORIA—The loss entailed through the burning of the "Queen City" Sunday, will amount to something between \$30,000 and \$40,000, fully covered by insurance. Until the hull and machinery of the burnt steamer can be examined it is impossible to say just what will be done with the "Queen City" as regards rebuilding her.

VICTORIA—Tenders will be received up to 3 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 18, for painting and other work to be done to the City Hall, as per specifications, which can be seen at the office of W. W. Northcott, Supt. of Public Works, to whom tenders must be addressed.

VICTORIA—Arrangements are in contemplation for the renovation of the Angel rooms, Langley street, which with the adjoining premises, the Langley rooms, were recently the scene of a fire. The alterations will involve a cost of \$1,480. C. E. Watkins is the architect.

VANCOUVER—The City Council, at its meeting Monday night decided to call for new tenders for the dredging and back filling portion of the work in connection with the Coal Harbor Causeway. Tenders are now being received and will be considered at the Board of Public Works meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 18th.

At the last Board of Public Works meeting it was recommended that the contract be let to the Dominion Construction Co., whose tender was \$16,962.50, although the Pacific Dredging Co. had put in a figure at a later date of \$3,000.00 lower. As this latter tender was submitted after the time for tenders had expired, objections were raised to the idea of giving the latter company the job. Hence the recommendation that it go to the Dominion Construction Co., whose tender was strictly in order. It is not expected in local contracting circles that many figures will be submitted outside that of the Pacific Dredging Co.

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British Columbia Record

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PRINCE RUPERT—It is reported that plans are under way for the construction of four steel freighters of 5,000 tons each at the big drydock plant at Prince Rupert.

EDMONDS—At the last council meeting the allocation of the \$25,000 for ward improvements was considered, and the councillors from the north put in claims for substantial improvement to the Hastings Road. These estimates will be considered later.

VANCOUVER—Authority has been received from Ottawa whereby the material from the government dredge Mastodon may be used in the construction of the new C. P. R. Pier B for filling purposes. What method will be followed in hauling material from the dredge to the construction location is not as yet announced, although by scows and tugs is regarded as the most feasible way.

VICTORIA—Mr. C. Nickerson and two other property owners on Davie St. between Fort St. and Leighton Road, who are trying to get their street improved, told the streets committee yesterday that they thought they could get the required number of signatures to a petition calling for the laying of a light asphalt pavement, 26 feet wide, with four-foot boulevards on either side and surface drains at a total cost of \$7,368.

VICTORIA—With regard to the proposed agreement in connection with resurfacing Oak Bay Ave. the assistant engineer has reported to the streets and sewers committee that the agreement should provide to resurface with asphaltic concrete a 12-foot strip on each side of the car tracks outside the ties, and that the track strip between should be scarified, resurfaced and oiled. This work could be done properly for approximately \$14,000.

VICTORIA—The streets committee of the City Council yesterday decided to proceed with the construction of sewers along Walker and John Sts. and along Queens Ave. from Quadra to Blanshard. The city engineer reported that \$49,000 is still available from the 1913 sewer bylaw. According to the bylaw there are still 39 streets to be sewered or completed, upon 26 of which there are no houses and upon nine of which there is but one house. Because of this the city engineer has issued a list of streets which he suggests are more urgently in need of sewer connection than the 25 upon which there are no houses. He suggests that \$45,000 be spent on this work, reserving \$7,000 for contingencies.

VANCOUVER—The regular meeting of the Intermunicipal Industries Committee will be held Wednesday afternoon, at 2:30 o'clock, at the City Hall.

VANCOUVER—Ratepayers are reminded that the time for the allowance of the rebate of 10 per cent allowed on taxes in the city, expires at 5 o'clock on Friday afternoon.

The Empire Pulp & Paper Mills, Ltd., organized by Mr. Whelan and associates, has taken over the old Swanson Bay properties and will build a new plant while the Colonial Pulp & Paper Mills, Ltd., will erect another large plant at Quatsino. Men are now engaged clearing land for the building.
