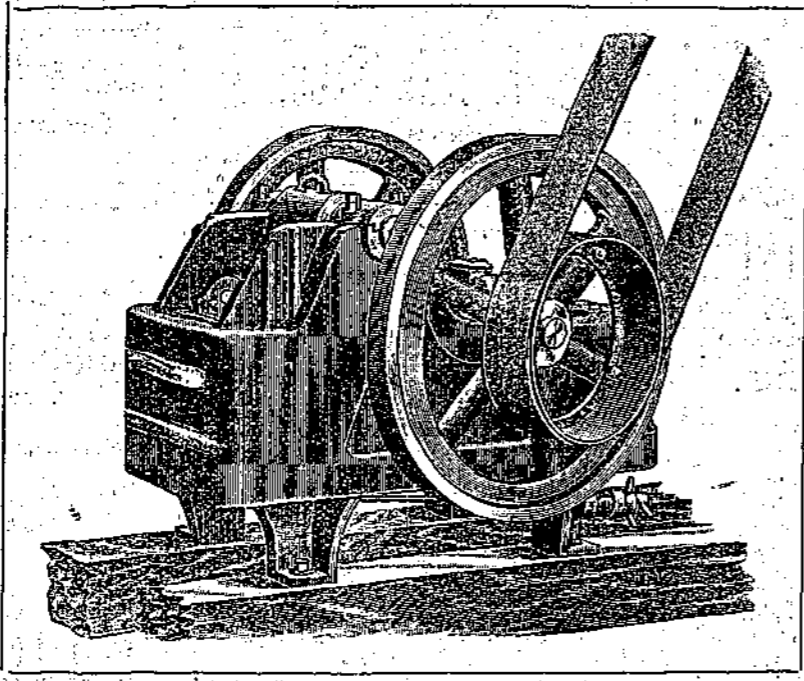

J. C. Haas has returned from a business trip to Spokane.

Dr. G. W. Averill, dentist, will remain in the city until Monday, May 8th, when he goes to Midway for a short time. The doctor's rooms are in the Windsor hotel.

The Boundary Creek Milling and Lumber company have purchased another complete sawmill plant. The company intend placing the new mill in the vicinity of Rock Creek.

Mr. E. W. Bealey, of New Zealand, is in the city visiting his brother, Mr. R. J. Bealey. Mr. Bealey owns a large sheep-farm in New Zealand, and is on his way to England. He visited Rossland about two years ago.

A smoking concert was given in Rendell's hall on Wednesday evening. An excellent impromptu programme was carried out. The proceeds went to swell the funds for the purchase of band instruments.

David Beath has returned from the east, where he spent the winter visiting friends in Barrie and Whitby. While east Mr. Beath met Rev. Mr. Paton, the pioneer missionary of this district, who is now stationed near Barrie, Ont.

A Court of Revision, composed of Mayor Hardy and Ald. Galloway, Cropley, and Sutherland, sat on Thursday to adjudicate upon appeals from the assessment roll for the current year. There were no appeals, but the Court decided to increase the assessment on Copper-street property.

The baseball enthusiasts have organized for the season with the following officers: H. Howson, president; Jas. Sutherland, vice-president; W. S. Keith, secretary-treasurer; D. McKinnon, captain; and a committee composed of M. O'Leary, Geo. F. Miller and R. Cunningham. There are a lot of new players in the city and a strong team is promised.

Dr. Christie and Dr. Richards went out to R. Kerr's ranch yesterday and destroyed 60 hogs. The hogs were dying at the rate of five or six a day when Mr. Kerr reported the matter to Dr. Christie. He went out to the farm and at once decided that the hogs had the cholera. Dr. Richards confirmed the diagnosis, and the hogs were immediately destroyed.

Work has already been started on the C. P. R. branch lines to the different camps. A large force of men are engaged in clearing the right of way from the Greenwood railway yard to Deadwood and Copper camps. It is the intention of the company to immediately build the branch lines so as to be in a position to handle ores as soon as the main line is completed.

A New York despatch states that Paul Johnson, until lately with the Guggenheimer Smelting company of Mexico, would leave New York in a few days to take charge of the smelter for the British Columbia Copper company on that company's property at Greenwood. Officials of the B. C. Copper company informed THE TIMES that the announcement was rather premature. The B. C. Copper company will build a smelter to treat their own ores, but before this is done more work will be done on the Mother Lode.

D. W. Beecher, president of the Exchange National Bank, Grand Forks, N. D., and C. E. Towle, cashier of the same bank at Park River, arrived in the city Thursday evening. Mr. Beecher is treasurer of the Winnipeg Gold-mining Company, and Mr. Towle is a heavy shareholder in the same company. They remained at the mine for a day before coming to the city. Mr. Beecher, who is a frequent visitor to the district, is well pleased with the outlook at the Winnipeg and astonished at the rapid growth of Greenwood since his previous visit about a year ago.

Last Sunday a lot of jolly people took advantage of the delightful sunshine to enjoy a picnic on Elkhorn hill above the brewery. The situation for a gathering of this nature is a perfect one. Elkhorn hill overlooks the city, there is plenty of good water and the grounds are perfect for picnicing. Sunday's party included Messrs. Portmann, Deutcher and their many friends, and they all thoroughly enjoyed themselves, and were all of the opinion that it is not necessary to wander a long distance from the city to secure ideal recreation grounds.

PAYING WITHOUT AUTHORITY.

THE statements of Alderman Galloway regarding the Government street excavation and the payment to contractors are of the most serious nature and require a thorough investigation. The practice of making payments without authority from the council will land the city in the hands of a government auditor. The ratepayers are entitled to some security. The statement that the contractors have already been paid more than the full amount to which they were entitled, is based on a simple calculation which can be easily verified or disproven by the council. The difference between Alderman Galloway's figures and those said to have been furnished by the city engineer, make a difference of nearly \$400, an increase of over 60 per cent on the original contract price. The ratepayers are entitled to know whether Alderman Galloway's or the city engineer's figure's are correct. The payment of the contractor was irregular in any case. Irregularities,

however, are the rule and not the exception in connection with municipal affairs in this city. Those who pay the bills have a remedy. It is only a question of time until they are driven to make use of the machinery wisely placed at their disposal for the protection of their own interests.

THE C. P. R. TOO STRONG.

THE withdrawal of the application for the Kettle River charter does not mean that the fight of railway competition is over. Competition is delayed, but it is not possible that the policy of allowing one railway company, however enterprising, a monopoly of the business of the country will last. It is less possible that sentimental twaddle will continue to thwart legitimate efforts to increase trade by establishing communication through natural channels. The people of Canada have fed and subsidized the Canadian Pacific Railway company to such an extent that it is powerful enough to dictate when and where competition shall be allowed. The great national highway, built by the money of the people, has become a great national taskmaster, stronger than the people themselves. It is only a question of time when conditions will change and railway competition will be established or railways will be under the full control of the government of the country. The present state of affairs cannot last.

The Canadian Pacific Railway company was absolutely without a single logical argument in its opposition to the Corbin charter. Its success is not due to reason but to brute force. When the company unblushingly advances the argument that because the Corbin railway would pass through an easier country than its line, it could serve the people at a cheaper rate, would interfere with the C. P. R. business and consequently should be refused admission into the Boundary Creek country, it can be readily seen that the Canadian Pacific Railway company's strength in the parliament of Canada lies outside its argumentative powers.

The Canadian Pacific railway cannot be blamed for using all its influence in the protection of its own business. Every business man would destroy competition if it were in his interests to do so. The fault lies in the parliament and the people allowing a powerful company to dictate a policy that will, if pursued, retard the development of the great natural resources of the country.

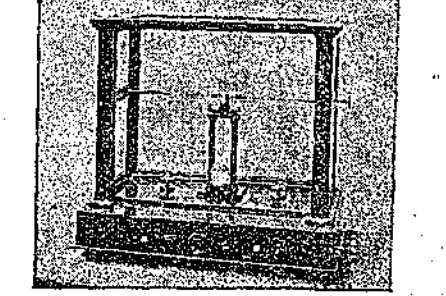

THE CITY COUNCIL.

The Payment to Contractors—A Suggested Hotel Monopoly.

The regular meeting of the city council was held in the court house Monday evening last, and all members, with the exception of Alderman Naden, were present.

Alderman Galloway was anxious to know how the contractors for the excavation on Government street had been paid 75 per cent. of the contract price without reference to the city council. The mayor replied that the payment was based on the figures of the city engineer. In answer to a question from Alderman Galloway he also stated that the engineer figured that the excavation amounted to 1,500 yards. Alderman Galloway said there was something unusual about the whole proceedings. He was prepared to state that the excavation did not amount to 1,000 yards. Without any authority from the council the contractors had been paid 75 per cent. on 1,500 yards, which amounted to more than the full price on the correct measurement. Any member of the council could figure the number of yards for himself. Every foot of earth went to grade Government street. The grade made by the contractors was 650 feet long, 22 feet wide and 2 feet deep. This made 1,000 cubic yards. Now, they would all agree with him that there was considerable expansion when the earth was taken from a solid bank and placed on a streets. As one of the members of the finance committee he would refuse to pass the account if presented to the council.

A committee from the hotel keepers, consisting of Messrs. Nelson, Weeks and Branson, waited on the council and urged that no more liquor licenses be granted. They were quite willing to pay more for their licenses if they were protected by the refusal to grant further licenses. No action was taken by the council.

As the numerous loan by-laws are awaiting the final revision of the assessment roll, the council adjourned after routine business.
