Red Letter Day for Lunenburg Presbyterians.

Commodious Church Edifice Opened And Dedicated for Worship—Interesting Sketch Of the Founders of the Early Church.

Lunenburg, Nov. 21.—The Presbyterian Church which has been closed for the past six months, was formally opened, and dedicated for public worship today. Dr. Forrest and Professor Falconer assisting the pastor, Rev. D. A. Frame in the opening service. Here follows a sketch of the various pastors and the progress of the church under their pastorate, which for lack of space we omit, until we come to those of most recent date.

Rev. D. McGillivray succeeded to the pastorate in May, 1891, and his regime lasted for twelve years. He was a man of amiable disposition, gentle and pleasing in manner, and gave most liberally to all charitable objects. His sermons were methodical, and interesting, and at times eloquent. Mr. McGillivray was an ardent advocate of missions, and his many friends remember him for his many good qualities, and his sterling Christian character.

Prostrated under a severe attack of capillary bronchitis, his people offered to supply the pulpit and give him six months' travel and recuperate, and return to them again; and failing in this, they gave him a handsome parting gift—expressive of their good will and appreciation.

The Present Incumbent.

A congregational meeting was held on the 25th day of July, 1904, and the mantle fell upon Rev. D. A. Frame, formerly of Wallace, N. S., Mr. Frame was inducted into the pastorate on the same year, and has proved to

be a faithful expositor of the Scriptures, an energetic and popular pastor, and the congregation and all the branches of the church service are in a flourishing condition.





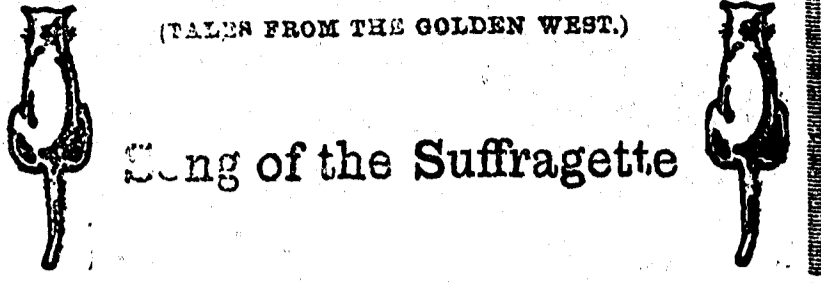
