UNIVERSITY CONTRACT WILL PROBABLY BE LET THIS WEEK

University, Point Grey—Although tenders have been opened for the excavation, concrete work and part of the electrical work nothing official has been given out as to who were the low tenderers, but it is likely that an award will be made either today or tomorrow.

It is the desire of the board to get this work under way as soon as possible and as the necessary finances are available no trouble is expected to prevent the bldgs being completed.

TENDERS CLOSE TODAY FOR SAPPERTON SEWERS

Sewers, New Westminster—Tenders for the const. of alternate outfalls for the Sapperton sewers No. 2 will close at the office of W. A. Duncan, City Clerk, at 12 o'clock noon today.

The work consists of constructing about 540 ft. reinf. conc. monolithic conduit, laying and jointing reinf. conc. pipes on Columbia Ave. from Debeck St. to Glen Brook, and for the const. of an outfall through the Brunette Saw Mills and the laying of conc. pipes and syphon.

Tenders will probably be opened at the next meeting of the council and it is expected that a contract will be awarded at once so that const. work can be started without further delay.

SAANICH COUNCIL DISCUSS THREE MONEY BY-LAWS

Municipal Works, Saanich—No definite action was taken at a special meeting of the Saanich Council on the three money by-laws which are expected to be voted on by the rate-payers at an early date. These are for the raising of funds for the installation of a water system, to finance the paving enterprise, and to increase the educational facilities of the district. The announcement was made that the city had not yet prepared the details of the contemplated agreement for the purchase of water by Saanich from Victoria.

ROYAL JUBILEE HOSPITAL STILL REMAINS UNDECIDED

Hospital, Victoria—At a meeting of the board of directors of the Royal Jubilee Hospital no action was taken in connection with the new bldg. Work on the power house is proceeding rapidly and another meeting will be held in the near future and it is likely that some action will be taken at that time.

CONTRACT AWARDED FOR WEST VANCOUVER TRESTLE

Trestle, West Vancouver—At a meeting of the West Vancouver council the contract for the const. of a trestle 380 ft. x 55 ft. was awarded to Rogers & Harmon at \$3,669. The trestle is to be erected on Spencer Ave.

Edmonton Building.

Building permits issued in Edmonton during the month of August numbered 72 with a total value of \$122,050, as compared with 237 permits with a value of \$293,470 for the same month last year.

Tenders for Scow.

Scow Material, Prince Rupert—Tenders have been received from five firms for material to be used in scow const. All tenders were referred to the engineer and board of works with power to act.

CONTRACTORS IN DISPUTE OVER COLONIAL APARTMENTS

A law suit that is of keen interest to the trade is now being carried on in the courts between J. H. Vickers, contractor, and B. T. Rogers, owner of the Colonial Apts., which were erected last year by Mr. Vickers.

The suit involves a claim for extras, balance on straight contract and general damages for alleged loss of time and profits. Kennerly Bryan, Northwest Trust Bldg., was the archt. for the bldg.

ENGINEER MAKES REPORT ON CHINA CREEK SEWERS

Sewers, Vancouver—At a meeting of the Vancouver and District Joint Sewerage Board yesterday, the board engineer reported that he had been able to construct the China and Canoe Creek sewers up to August, \$2500.00 cheaper than the lowest tender that was submitted for the work.

The Balaclava sewer was discussed, but nothing will be done with this for at least a couple of weeks.

ALL TENDERS REJECTED FOR STANLEY PARK PAVING

At a meeting of the Park Board tenders were opened for paving Stanley Park roads and the board decided to do the work by day labor. It was decided to put in culverts in place of the wooden bridge. The cost of the work will be about \$4,500.

WILL URGE COUNCIL TO PROCEED WITH CAUSEWAY

At a meeting of the Park Commissioners a committee was appointed to wait on the council and urge them to proceed as soon as possible with the proposed causeway for which the plans of City Engineer Fellowes was accepted a short while ago.

INVITE TENDERS FOR MUNICIPAL HALL REPAIRS

Repairs, North Vancouver—Tenders will be received by the Engineer of the District of North Vancouver for certain repairs to the Municipal Hall, Lynn Valley, until 10 a.m., Monday, Sept. 7. Spec. from the Engineer.

Kamloops Building.

Building permits issued in Kamloops for month of July amount to \$11,979 more than 1913. Out of the twelve cities in B. C., only three of them show an increase over last year, Oak Bay and North Vancouver being the other two, the latter place showing \$2,310 of an increase.

Fire and Insurance

The Dominion estimates for public buildings in Alberta for 1914 include:

ARCHITECTS INVITED TO INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION
Melbourne, June 30, 1914—The Australian government announces an international architectural competition for the purpose of selecting the architect of the Parliament House and possibly incidentally additional architect for other government structures of the new Federal Capital City, Canberra.

Only tentative outline sketch designs for the building are requested, and eight (8) prizes are offered aggregating £6,000, the first being £2,000, in addition to commission for service at the scale of the Royal Institute of British Architects.

Designs may be submitted in either Melbourne or London before March 31, 1915, and will be judged by the following jury of architects:
George T. Foote, of Australia.
John J. Burnet, of London.
Victor Laloux, of Paris.
Otto Wagner, of Vienna.
Louis E. Sullivan, of Chicago.

The decision of the jury will be final.

A program will be issued to any practicing architect on application to the High Commissioner for Australia in London. Works Departments of British Colonies, or British Embassies at Berlin, Madrid, Paris, Rome, St. Petersburg, Stockholm, Vienna, Washington, from whom also copies of text in French or German may be had on request. Copies in Esperanto may be obtained from the High Commissioner or from the Esperanto headquarters at Geneva.

The importance of this event is not to be measured by that of the foremost building of the commonwealth, but by the opportunity to establish an architectural standard not only for the entire future seat of government in Australia, but for a great new democracy of scope, scale and modern advantages as well as the climatic conditions differing radically from any prototype in Europe or elsewhere.
