**Theatre, Vancouver**—Architect Emil  
Guenther, North West Trust Building,  
has completed plans and specifications  
and will receive proposals from contrac-  
tors until Sept. 13, for altering a brick  
building on Hastings between Carrall  
and Abbott streets, and transforming  
same into a modern picture-play theatre.  
The theatre is to be for W. P. Dewees  
and will seat about 1,500. It is to be  
modern throughout.

The work will include the construction  
of the basement and a large main  
auditorium, with a ground floor and two  
balconies, embracing the remodelling of  
a 3-storey and basement brick structure.  
The building is located where the  
Merchants Bank is now occupying tempo-

work, tile and composition floors, brick

**COMPETITION OPEN.**  
**Dept. Bldgs., Ottawa**—The commission  
of architects appointed by the govern-  
ment, to direct the preparations of de-  
signs for the new departmental build-  
ings at Ottawa has just submitted its  
report outlining the conditions of the  
competition.

It will be open to competitors through-  
out the British Empire. There will be  
at least two buildings and probably a  
third one for the courts. Half a million  
superficial feet of floor space will have  
to be provided.

Designs of a general character will  
first be submitted and from this number  
the best six will be selected and the au-  
thors of these will be asked to elaborate  
their designs. The one finally selected  
will get the job of superintending the  
work based on his plans and will be  
given a five per cent commission. The  
cost of the buildings will probably ag-  
gregate five million dollars.

The other five competitors who will  
be asked to develop their general designs  
will each receive \$3,000. The sketches  
will be received up to January 2 next.  
Then three months will be given for the  
best half dozen to develop their plans.

The competitors whose plans are ac-  
cepted will be given a further period of  
four months to prepare working plans.  
Afterward tenders will be called for,  
but, in view of the time allowance, this  
will not be before next autumn.

The cost of the building will aggre-  
gate \$5,000,000 dollars. The other five  
competitors will be asked to develop  
their general designs and each will re-  
ceive \$3,000. The sketches will be re-  
ceived up to January 2, next. Then three  
months will be given for the best half  
dozen to develop their plans.

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
