A fortnight of good golf in Hedley in December is in itself a strong recommendation for the climate of the Similkameen. Even the snap at the end of the week seemed to improve it for golf for the balls travelled long distances over the frozen ground and there was not a vestige of snow or anything to hinder full enjoyment of the game.

The improvements to the hospital are nearing completion and will now require only a few days more. When fully completed they will allow for the admission of a few more patients and afford better accommodation for the hospital staff. The furnishing of the new apartments will now be a matter for the consideration of the board and also may afford an opportunity for some philanthropically inclined citizen to help on a good cause.

On Monday last the sun struck low water mark so far as shortening up in the evening is concerned. Oroville lost a valuable and highly esteemed citizen in the death of County Judge Peck which took place in Spokane last week. He had filled the office for Okanagan county for but a brief spell, being appointed to the position by the Governor of the state on the death of the former incumbent of the office to fill out the term until the regular time for election of a new judge. Deceased was an intimate friend of Mr. and Mrs. Creelman who spent Christmas of 1909 with him and Mrs. Peck.

There will be special Masonic service on Sunday, Christmas, when special music will be provided and Rev. A. H. Cameron the chaplain of the lodge will preach. They aim to have the service on the Sunday nearest to the festival of St. John the evangelist, December 27th and this year it falls on Christmas day. A number of visiting brethren from Keremeos and Princeton are expected and Mrs. J. A. Brown, of Keremeos, has kindly agreed to take charge of the special music and sing a voluntary herself, which is ample evidence of the treat in store.

On Monday night a couple of cases came up for hearing in the local court but important evidence being lacking in each case they were remanded for a days to enable witnesses and exhibits to be procured. One was a case of cattle stealing and the other a case of petty larceny. In the first, James Steves was charged with stealing a cow and calf off the Princeton range and selling to P. Burns and Co. The cow belonged to Moeace an old Indian woman down at the mission near here. The other case was against the Indian Felix who was charged with stealing a grip and clothing belonging to Geo. Allison and Billy Daly. The grip was lost out of the rig over a year ago and Felix and another Indian who drove up behind were suspected of getting it although they denied it at the time, but evidence which has come up since, led to the laying of the charge.

Princeton business men took action last week to secure a good winter trail through to Steamboat camp, which showed that they were alive to the situation, and their ambition to be for Steamboat what Seattle was to the Klondike is commendable. No matter whether Steamboat will amount to anything or not the amount of boosting it has received is bound to create a certain amount of travel there and Princeton may just as well reap the benefit of it as Hope or any other point on the west of the Hope range. Wherever there is abundance of smoke it is reasonable to assume that there is some fire and it is to be hoped that the Steamboat smoke which has issued in such huge volume from certain quarters in Vancouver may follow the natural rule and be attended with a commensurate amount of genuine combustion. h. If for irrigation, describe the lands to be irrigated giving acreage: 40 acres of lot 1991 lying on the north east corner of said lot.

i. The area of Crown Land intended to be occupied by proposed works: The ditch and pipes or flumes leading from the point of diversion to the lands of the applicant will be about two miles in length and will run through Crown lands, and a sufficient width will be required to construct and maintain said works.

j. This notice was posted on the 5th day of December 1910, and the application will be made to the commissioner on the 4th day of January, 1911.
