CAMBORNE

Improved Prospects on Fish Creek

Fish Creek has a better outlook for the coming season than it has ever had. The Imperial Development Company, who own the Eva, have strengthened their finances and intend pushing development ahead, so as to more economically handle the ore from their mine and they will probably also enlarge their mill.

The Great Northern Mines intend doubling the capacity of their mill making 20 stamps, which will enable them to handle their ore at considerably less cost. This mill has been very economically managed, all along by Mr. Street. Considerable development work will be done at the mine.

The Mammoth is looking remarkably well, and the Dig, Showing has shown steady improvement with the work done. This property is considered to be one of the biggest silver-lead properties in the province, and some mining men express the opinion that it will make a second St. Eugene.

The Silver Dollar is turning out well and is today one of the most promising looking properties in the Lardeau. The owners, the Elwood Tinworkers Company, deserve success for the manner in which they have stayed with this section of the country and the present prospects of the mine fully warrant the investment of capital in what promises to become a valuable property.

It is expected work will shortly be resumed on the Beatrice. This is a most promising property although the development work done lately has not been attended with great success in developing the bodies. It should be a case of follow the ore already developed.

There is a vast extent of gold and silver bearing ground on Fish Creek, and with the steady improvement in silver-lead mining, new smelters, the demand for zinc ore, and the revival of mining generally, Fish Creek should go ahead by leaps and bounds. Here is a great field for the capitalist, and one in which huge fortunes should await those who get in on the ground floor.

What is wanted on Fish Creek more than anything else is improved transportation. The McBride government was going to do strokes in opening up the country, but Mr. Hawthornthwaite, the Socialist minister in control of the government, seems to have kept it so busy guessing it has not been able to do anything else. There is a fine field for government enterprise on Fish Creek, where an electric tramway should be built by government from deep water to Camborne. The McBride government have been telling us of their belief in government railways. Fish Creek affords a splendid opportunity to test their sincerity. The outlook of the country would warrant such an undertaking in control of the government. Mr. P. P. were not asleep half his time he would have done something in the matter ere this time.

BIG STRIKE

Sensational Story From Yale

The Commercial publishes the following: "A veritable mountain of gold copper ore has been discovered just back of Yale." This was the statement of Conductor T. Coughlin, of the C. P. R. He says this big deposit of mineral was located twenty years ago in a gold rush to that country, by some men from the States. When the prospectors returned after many years to locate it, the underbrush had the exposed ore from view, and it could not be found. Nat. Darling, of Vancouver, knew of the lost mine and of the many attempts of British Columbia prospectors to find it. Now it has been the good fortune of Ed Stout to rediscover the ore body, where it is exposed on the surface. The lead once discovered was followed in every direction for many miles. In fact it can easily be imagined that almost all the mountain is solid ore.

RAIL AND STEAMER

The C. P. R. handled 39,617 cars in its Winnipeg yards last year.

Mr. Coughlin stated that two other American companies near Yale are working quietly on a rather large scale and saying nothing about it. One is the International Gold Syndicate, who are developing a free milling claim on Stwash Creek. A ten-stamp mill has already been established.

Another company is also installing a large plant to enable them to combine hydraulic operations in the spring. They have a bank half-a-mile long that they will wash for precious metal. The bank is said to go very high in gold. This is also an American company. In fact Americans and Chinamen are making things very lively at the scene of the gold excitement of former days. A short distance away from this hydraulic claim is the bar where so much gold has been taken out in the past and which was said to have run \$8 a yard.

There are now all through the district between three hundred and four hundred Chinese rooking the river sands, and all make good wages. From one store at Yale the year round there goes forward to Vancouver \$400 a month in Gold Dust.

THE STANDARD MINE

Big Body of Ore Developed

Supt. Rumens, who is in charge of the development work being done by the Prince Mining and Development Company, on their property in Standard Basin, came to this week and reports driving a cross-cut in the lead 90ft north of the intermediate below No. 2 tunnel. This cross-cut ran through 17ft of solid ore, but as the lead dips about 35 degrees the probability is the true width of the ore is about 12ft. The ore also appears to be of excellent grade. This is the most important strike made on the property, and there is now a body of ore in sight averaging six feet in width and proved to a depth of 80 feet and a length of 180 feet, while the north drift is still in solid ore, showing the ore-chute runs in that direction. The mine never looked better than now.

SANDON MINES

The Idaho mill has resumed, and the mine shows more ore than ever.

LUMBERING

The product of the Burton Saw Co. of Vancouver, is surely winning its way to the hearts of the millmen of the province, who have for the greater part shown a very kindly disposition to assist the company by placing trial orders and recommending the company to brother manufacturers. The shareholders at a meeting last week were greatly interested in the finely equipped manufacturing plant, and surprised at the amount of business this far handled by their company, the result being that several present considered it advisable to increase their stock holdings to a very material extent. Though the works have only been in full swing some six weeks orders to the value of several thousand dollars have been executed.

The Watrous Engine Works have secured the contract for supplying the bulk of the machinery required for the new sawmill of the Kamloops Lumber Company Ltd.

Owing to the dullness of the lumber market the Columbia River Lumber Company are not getting out any logs for their heavier mill this winter, and intend closing that mill down for a year.

NEW LUMBER COMPANY

President Arrives to Arrange for Building Operations

Mr. Mundy, president of the Mundy Lumber Company, which will operate at Three Valley Lake, arrived in the city this week to arrange for starting the buildings. The lumber business at Three Valley Lake will be carried on by two companies, the Eagle River Lumber Company, incorporated under the laws of the State of Virginia, with a capital of \$500,000, and which controls the 100 square miles of timber limits acquired from the Dominion government, and the Mundy Lumber Company, which will be the manufacturing company. This company is incorporated under the laws of the State of Virginia with a capital of \$500,000, with provision to increase as required. Mr. Mundy is president of the Mundy Lumber Company, and Mr. Schoonmaker, vice president of this company. The investors are eastern bankers.

Arrangements are being made with the C. P. R. to put in a siding and station at the site of the mill at Three Valley Lake. The millwright has also arrived to proceed with the construction of the mill, and went to Arrowhead Tuesday to look over the plant supplied by the Watrous Engine Works to the Arrowhead Lumber Company. The mill will have a capacity of 60,000 feet a day, and it is intended to build a planing mill to take care of the output of the mill, and also a shingle mill with a capacity of 100,000 shingles a day. It is intended to have the mill in operation by May 1st. The company will immediately proceed with the erection of a store, bunk house, boarding house, etc. The mill plant will include a single band saw and a resaw.

YALE-CARIBOO

The deferred election in Yale-Cariboo on Tuesday lacked the incentive to enthusiastic work which would have been the case had there been a scintilla of hope for defeating the candidates. Yet the friends of both candidates were active in bringing voters to the polls and succeeded in recording a fair proportion of the electors, though not as large as that of former occasions.

Our Conservative friends were particularly active as they reasoned that their party would lose prestige were they to allow the election to go by default, and this would be to their disadvantage in future contests.

The Liberals of Vernon have no reason to be despondent at the result in the city. At the last local election the Conservative candidate had a majority of 109, which is now wiped out and a majority of 8 recorded for the Liberals. This indicates a considerable change in sentiment. Other polling places in the neighborhood also did well for Ross, so the Liberal party in the Okanagan Valley are encouraged to persevere in the good work and elect a Liberal member for the Legislature at the first opportunity.

GENERAL NEWS
