duty to the Canadian government

of 55 cents a net ton. The new

regulations will, if adopted, bring

the coal duties both ways to a

level, and will make the matters

much more simple and equitable.

THE KING'S PIE


THE city of Gloucester, in England, annually presents the King with a pie, almost from time immemorial, Gloucester, until the year 1834, followed the custom of expressing its loyalty to the throne by sending to the sovereign a lamprey pie. In 1834 the custom was suspended, but it was revived in 1835, and has since continued.

It was felt that the year of the Diamond Jubilee required some special effect, and therefore the 1897 pie, which was in a gold dish, was of a more than usually elaborate character. This pie weighed twenty pounds and was adorned with truffles, fine prawns on gold skewers, and aspic jelly. On the top was a representation of the royal coat of arms, and encircling the aspic jelly was an attached streak of royal blue, and at the base were four golden lions.

By the survival of an ancient custom, the town of Yarmouth is bound to furnish to the sheriffs of Norwich annually a hundred herrings, baked in twenty-four pies, which are then sent to the lord of the Manors of East Dereham, who conveys them to the king.



THE WEST IS SNUBBED

In British Columbia a howl is going up over the new reciprocity treaty. There is no doubt but this province received shabby treatment and was sacrificed for eastern Canada. Take for instance the requests of the lead and zinc mine owners. No recognition whatever was given them. The fruit growers of the province will be placed in direct competition with those in the United States. But the zinc miner is probably the hardest hit. With no smelters in Canada to take his product he must look to the United States where there are zinc smelters for a market. As the Nelson Daily News puts it "This Canadian ore cannot be shipped to the American smelters, because of the heavy duty which the United States government imposes on the lead and zinc contents. Had the duty on lead and zinc been removed as a result of the tariff negotiations it would have meant the operation of many good properties in this country that are at present idle. The result would have been increased prosperity for the people of the Kootenays and a large annual addition to Canada's wealth. The interests of the people of this section have, however, been as ruthlessly sacrificed in this respect as in regard to fruit growing and ranching."

Supposing Sir Wilfrid was to come west on another trip now what a hum dinger of a reception he would get from his British Columbia friends who are in the mining and fruit growing business.

Nelson News: The people of the Kootenays will be pleased to know that Hon. W. S. Fielding and those who were associated with him on the Canadian side in the recent tariff negotiations have

arranged for a reduction on unshelled peanuts shipped into the United States to one-half of one cent per lb. It must have taken a lot of argument to secure this concession from the American representatives.
