GRIFFS in Kootenay has counted their chickens and 'Big Bill' Gallinger has been elected. Mr. Gallinger claimed support from Southeast Kootenay by reason of having obtained a subsidy for the Kootenay Central railway. His claim was recognized and weighed heavy in the financial balance and was the one and only strong argument advanced in favor of 'Big Bill'. A number of Conservatives, sufficient to make up his majority, supported Gallinger.

The fact that the country had gone Liberal had its influence. A significant feature at Steele was that but of 130 names on the voting list only 52 ballots were cast.

The people of Nova Scotia showed their appreciation of W. S. Fielding by electing every Liberal candidate in that Province. The Liberal party will make full payment for this service in about 18 months by making W. S. Fielding premier of Canada in 1906.

There is considerable 'hot air' at present emanating from the Liberal party at Steele mingled with 'I told you' advice as to how 'Big Bill' carried Steele by a majority of nine. It was Conservatives that pulled 'Big Bill' to the front here, not his Liberal friends.

The London lead quotations closed at 113 on Monday after going down several points during the latter part of last week. Although slight fluctuations happen, the tone of the market is most satisfactory to the lead miners of Kootenay.

The Upper Columbia and Kootenay valleys are today depending upon the mineral and agricultural development that is sure to come, and that follows railway construction, for its new settlers and prosperity. Transportation facilities are the absorbing need of East Kootenay. Every enterprise in the district in one way or another depends on the advance of the Kootenay Central.

The need of a resident constable at Fort Steele, and the district east of the Kootenay river, has been strongly impressed upon the government during the past week. We want no temporary appointment. If there is a town in this district that needs a constable at this time it is Fort Steele. We cannot understand why the government say fit to dispose of the services of Constable Laidcoat at a time when his services were in constant demand.

The certainty that a seat in the House of Commons will be found for R. L. Gordon gives great satisfaction to the Conservatives of this district.
