CONDENSED NEWS

A fire in New York yesterday destroyed \$500,000 worth of property. The Guatemalan revolutionist General Marrozzin, has been killed and his army scattered.

Those who had the Kootenay fever have apparently got the Klondyke fever now. 50 people left Sandon for the Yukon last week.

The winners of the Derby for the last four years, Mr. Gubbins, the Prince of Wales, Lord Rosebery, and Mr. McCalmont, all have horses in training for jumping races this season.

The Government have now about 30 tons of supplies at Dyer and Skagway. It was contracted for the taking of 15 tons over Chilcoot pass by the new aerial railway, with an option of 15 tons more at 15c. a pound.

Every dollar of gold in the world has cost over \$2.00, and of every 50,000 gold mines in the world, only two have paid. These are statistics which ought to stagger even a person who is getting ready to go to the Yukon.

M. D. Rucker, the bicycle manufacturer who broke into English racing with a great flourish of trumpets, and gave the Prince of Wales 5,000 guineas for a colt worth the hundredth part of that sum, has given up the game already and sold his horses.

The value of mineral exports from Southern Kootenay through the port of Nelson to date amounts to \$1,423,382, but the corresponding period of 1897, Great interest is being taken at present by mining men in properties on Forty-Nine and Hall Creeks in Nelson district.

It is stated on good authority that the quarrel between the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific, which originated over the Toronto to North Bay business is practically settled by the virtual back down of the Grand Trunk, which has issued a circular cancelling the low rates announced into Winnipeg.

Inspector of Mines McGregor, who stated for Dawson some weeks ago with several tons of supplies and a number of horses has abandoned the trip. McGregor got as far as Lake Labarge, where he received orders from Major Walsh, Administrator of the Yukon district, who is camped at Big Salmon River, to abandon the trip because of the impossibility of reaching Dawson with horses.

About two years ago Alex. Begg, formerly of Dunbow, Alberta, now of Victoria, who styled himself Crofter's Commissioner, to distinguish his personality from that of the late editor of the Mining Record, secured a charter for a railway into the Lake country. This charter controlled the proposed route of the C. P. R. into the Klondyke, and to secure it Dan Mann, who is to build the connecting link of railway from Telegraph Creek, has paid over to Begg a cool \$50,000.

A London cable says: It came out at the winding up proceedings in connection with Mr. James Huddart's Canadian Australian Steamship Co. that large borrowings are needed immediately to continue the business. As it is, the total liabilities which are expected to rank amount to \$38,000, while the free assets are estimated at \$10,000.

A party of Klondykers from London passed through Windsor and Detroit recently en route to Seattle. Near Glencoe, five destroyers the special baggage car of the party. It originated in one of the trunks, and got it good start before Glencoe was reached. At that station the burning car was cut out of the train and side tracked, but before the flames could be extinguished, only two of the heavy sleeping bags for use in the cold country remained of the outfit of the company. The destroyed baggage was valued at several thousand dollars, and the owners expect to hold the road responsible for the loss.

They have a law in Washington, D. C., declaring that no cycle shall be ridden on the streets with the lower end of the handle bars on a plane lower than four inches below the top of the saddle at its centre, and the rider shall at all times keep his head in such a position as to command a view of not less than 200 feet ahead.

Neil Keith who has got the sub-contract for the construction of the Teslin Lake railway has moved his outfit as far as Vancouver, but up to the present has been unable to arrange for transportation to the north.

A branch of the Molson's bank is being opened in Vancouver, under the management of H. Lockwood, assistant inspector, who will also act as supervisor of the branches of the bank in British Columbia and in the North West.

The Winnipeg Tribune says: "Mr. Roulds, whose sister is the wife of Chief Factor Camsell, at Fort Simpson, has received a letter which states that while several of the boys were excavating for the foundation of the cabin on the Liard river, where it empties into the Mackenzie, near Fort Simpson, they came upon rich deposits of placer gold, the nuggets being the size of barley. This find indicates that the placer deposits are not confined to the western slope of the Rocky Mountains, but that they exist on the eastern slope as well, which is most reasonable and what might be expected."

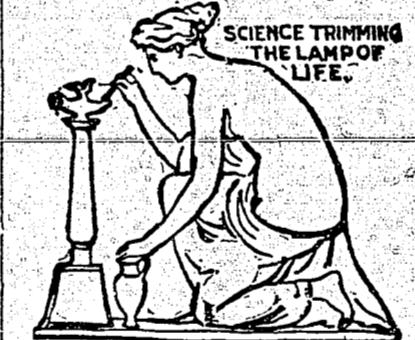
