The correspondence which took place between Thomas R. McInnes, as lieutenant-governor, and the secretary of state, has been published. Its publication can have but one effect. It shows clearly that Mr. McInnes sought to use his position for the advancement of his political fortunes, and incidentally for the advancement of the interests of the political party with which he had identified himself.

FROM figures prepared by the finance department at Ottawa yesterday, it is claimed that the Laurier government will be able to show a substantial surplus when the accounts for the present fiscal year are made up. It does not matter very much whether this result is reached through the efforts of Laurier and his ministers, or in

spite of them. As a rule the people hold the government responsible for depressions, and as an offset all governments take credit to themselves for such prosperity as the country enjoys.

LONDON, July 6.—Certain distinguished correspondents of the Times having advocated state-aided migration to South Africa as a means of preventing further troubles there, and that journal having supported the scheme, Mr. W. T. Preston has written a strong letter which appears in today's Times, in protest.

Japanese Help Welcomed. LONDON, July 6.—In the house of commons today the parliamentary secretary of the foreign office, William St. John Broderick announced that the government of Japan had received assurances that the prompt despatch of a large force to Taku would be welcomed by her majesty's government.

News From Pretoria. LONDON, July 5.—Lord Roberts reports from Pretoria under date of July 5 that lieutenant Rundle of the carabineers and a patrol were captured by the Boers near Pretoria July 4.

Canadians Coming Home. LONDON, July 5.—A number of members of the first Canadian contingent sent to South Africa sailed for home on the Allan line steamer Parisian today.
